Fiscal Analysis

SB 96 designates four memorial highways and bridges located in Oklahoma, as well as clarifies the designation of the "William Mark Miller Memorial Highway" in Cotton County. Title 69 O.S. § 1600 provides that the costs associated with signage related to the naming of highways and bridges is to be paid by the group sponsoring or requesting the sign, except in instances of naming a highway or bridge to honor members of the United States Armed Forces, Oklahoma Highway Patrol, peace officers, and first responders who were killed in the performance of their duties.

The Oklahoma Department of Transportation (ODOT) currently estimates a cost of \$1,300 per location that meets these qualifications, with one sign needed at each end of the designated highway or bridge.

The CCR to SB 96 restores the title; therefore, there is no change in the fiscal impact analysis from the previous engrossed version of the measure.
