Supp. 9 2018, Section 34), which relates to interment or cremation assistance for indigent veterans; 10 specifying certain program shall provide reimbursement for unpaid interment or cremation; 11 increasing maximum reimbursement; modifying eligibility requirements for program; and providing 12 an effective date. 1.3 14 15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 16 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 394, O.S.L. 17 2016 (72 O.S. Supp. 2018, Section 34), is amended to read as 18 follows: 19 Section 34. A. The Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs 20 shall establish a program to provide assistance for the proper 21 interment or cremation of honorably discharged indigent veterans of 22 the United States Armed Forces. The program shall aid in obtaining 23 any available burial benefits from the United States Department of 24 Veterans Affairs or through private organizations. The program

shall provide for a burial grant for any indigent veteran or any person who qualifies for financial assistance reimbursement, as determined by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs, for unpaid expenses directly resulting from interment or cremation.

Maximum reimbursement shall not exceed Five Hundred Dollars

(\$500.00) One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per indigent veteran application.

- $\underline{\mathtt{B.}}$  Eligibility and approval requirements for the program shall be as follows:
- 1. The indigent veteran has been determined to be homeless as defined as follows: a homeless veteran is an individual without permanent housing who may live on the streets, stay in a shelter, mission, abandoned building or in any other unstable or non-permanent situation, and who is eligible under 38 Code of Federal Regulation 38.620;
- 2. The deceased shall be a veteran as defined by 38 U.S.C.

  101(2) and verified by discharge records. An Oklahoma resident who served in the National Guard or Reserve Component whose only service is active duty training or inactive duty for training but meets all other 38 Code of Federal Regulations 38.620 statutes is eligible for the Indigent Veteran Burial Revolving Fund Section 2 of this title;
- 2. No one shall have claimed the remains of the deceased Veteran;
  - 3. The Veteran shall have died in Oklahoma;

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- 5. The Veteran's estate did not possess money or other assets
  to pay for or defray funeral expenses The applicant shall provide
  documentation establishing the burial location of the deceased

  Veteran's remains in a cemetery or the location where the deceased

  Veteran's cremains have been permanently placed; and
- expenses of the deceased; The applicant shall provide documentation establishing that the deceased Veteran received a proper memorial headstone or marker at the place of his or her interment as provided for in Section 2306 of Title 38 of the United States Code or that a memorial headstone or marker meeting the same physical standards for size, material, composition, placement and informational content was provided in the event the deceased Veteran did not qualify under the provisions of Section 2306 of Title 38 of the United States Code.
- 7. C. The Executive Director of the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs or his or her designee shall make final approval of Indigent Veteran Burial Applications;
- 8. The approving authority and shall determine whether the deceased meets eligibility criteria and approves may approve funds to defray burial reimburse the costs. Reimbursement is limited to Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per application;

1	$9.$ D. Reimbursement $\frac{\text{will}}{\text{shall}}$ be paid from the Indigent
2	Veteran Burial Revolving Fund. If there are insufficient resources
3	in the Indigent Veteran Burial Revolving Fund, payment will shall be
4	made from the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs Revolving
5	Fund; and.
6	10. Once funds are available in the Indigent Veteran Burial
7	Revolving Fund the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs may be
8	reimbursed for payments made from the Oklahoma Department of
9	Veterans Affairs Revolving Fund.
10	$\underline{\mathtt{E.}}$ Rules and application processes for the implementation of
11	this program shall be promulgated by the Executive Director of the
12	Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs.
13	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
