8	An Act relating to public health; amending Section 44, Chapter 229, O.S.L. 2013, as amended by Section							
9	1, Chapter 141, O.S.L. 2014 (63 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 1-103a.1), which relates to public health							
10	advisory councils; creating the Home Care, Hospice and Palliative Care Advisory Council; providing for							
11	membership; providing for quorum; providing for appointments to certain council; requiring certain							
12	council to include certain jurisdictional areas; and providing an effective date.

15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:							
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 44, Chapter 229, O.S.L.							
17	2013, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 141, O.S.L. 2014 (63 O.S.							
18	Supp. 2014, Section 1-103a.1), is amended to read as follows:							
19	Section 1-103a.1 A. To assist and advise the State Board of							
20	Health and the State Department of Health, there are hereby created:							
21	1. The Consumer Protection Licensing Advisory Council;							
22	2. The Trauma and Emergency Response Advisory Council;							
23	3. The Infant and Children's Health Advisory Council;							

4. The Advancement of Wellness Advisory Council; and

1 5. The Home Care and, Hospice and Palliative Care Advisory Council.

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- 3 1. Each Except for the Home Care, Hospice and Palliative Care Advisory Council, each Public Health Advisory Council (Advisory 4 5 Council) created pursuant to subsection A of this section shall consist of seven (7) members. Two members shall be appointed by the 6 7 Governor, two members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, two members shall be appointed by the President 9 Pro Tempore of the Senate, and one member shall be appointed by the 10 State Board of Health. Appointments shall be for three-year terms. 11 Members of the Advisory Councils shall serve at the pleasure of and 12 may be removed from office by the appointing authority. Members shall continue to serve until their successors are appointed. Any 13 vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the original 14 15 appointments. Four members shall constitute a quorum.
 - 2. The Home Care, Hospice and Palliative Care Advisory Council shall consist of nine (9) members. Two members shall be appointed by the Governor, three members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, three members shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and one member shall be appointed by the State Board of Health. Five members shall constitute a quorum.
- 3. Each Advisory Council shall meet at least twice a year, but 23 no more than four times a year and shall elect a chair, a vice-chair 24

1	and a secretary from among its members. Each Advisory Council shall
2	only meet as required for election of officers, establishment of
3	meeting dates and times; rule development, review and
4	recommendation; and adoption of nonbinding resolutions to the State
5	Department of Health or the State Board of Health concerning matters
6	brought before the Advisory Council. Special meetings may be called
7	by the chair or by the concurrence of any three members.
8	C. 1. All members of the Consumer Protection Licensing
9	Advisory Council shall be knowledgeable of certain consumer issues
10	as specified below. The Consumer Protection Licensing Advisory
11	Council shall be composed as follows:
12	a. the Governor shall appoint:
13	(1) one member who is a licensed radiologist
14	assistant, and
15	(2) one member who is a licensed audiologist,
16	b. the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:
17	(1) one member who is a licensed radiologist, and
18	(2) one member representing the hearing-aid-fitting
19	industry,
20	c. the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
21	appoint:
22	(1) one member representing the medical
23	micropigmentation industry, and

1	(2) one member representing the hearing-impaired
2	public, and
3	d. the State Board of Health shall appoint one member
4	representing a diagnostic x-ray facility.
5	2. The jurisdiction areas of the Consumer Protection Licensing
6	Advisory Council shall include the hearing-aid-fitting industry, the
7	medical micropigmentation industry, the radiation industry and such
8	other areas as designated by the State Board of Health.
9	D. 1. All members of the Trauma and Emergency Response
10	Advisory Council shall be knowledgeable of issues that arise in a
11	hospital setting and issues that arise concerning emergency
12	response. The Trauma and Emergency Response Advisory Council shall
13	be composed as follows:
14	a. the Governor shall appoint:
15	(1) one member who is an administrative director of a
16	licensed ambulance service, and
17	(2) one member who is a Board Certified Emergency
18	Physician,
19	b. the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:
20	(1) one member who is a representative from a
21	hospital with trauma and emergency services, and
22	(2) one member who is a trauma surgeon with
23	privileges at a hospital with trauma and
24	emergency operative services,

1	c. the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
2	appoint:
3	(1) one member representing the trauma registrar of a
4	licensed hospital that is classified as providing
5	trauma and emergency operative services, and
6	(2) one member who is an Emergency Medical
7	Technician, and
8	d. the State Board of Health shall appoint one member who
9	is a critical care nurse.
10	2. The jurisdictional areas of the Trauma and Emergency
11	Response Advisory Council shall include emergency response systems
12	development, injury prevention, catastrophic health emergency,
13	trauma systems improvement and development and such other areas
14	designated by the State Board of Health.
15	E. 1. All members of the Infant and Children's Health Advisory
16	Council shall be knowledgeable of issues that arise in the area of
17	infant and children's health care. The Infant and Children's Health
18	Advisory Council shall be composed as follows:
19	a. the Governor shall appoint:
20	(1) one member who works for the state or for a
21	political subdivision on child abuse issues, and
22	(2) one member who is knowledgeable about childhood
23	immunizations,
24	b. the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:

1	(1) one member who is knowledgeable about newborn
2	screening issues, and
3	(2) one member licensed by the state as an
4	optometrist who has knowledge of vision screening
5	for children, <u>and</u>
6	(3) one member who is a licensed ophthalmologist in
7	this state with the knowledge of treating visual
8	deficiencies in children,
9	c. the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
10	appoint:
11	(1) one member who is licensed by the state as a
12	physician and works as a pediatrician, and
13	(2) one member who is licensed by the state as a
14	genetic counselor, and
15	d. the State Board of Health shall appoint one member who
16	is a physician licensed by the state who specializes
17	in the diagnosis and treatment of childhood injuries
18	in a trauma setting.
19	2. The jurisdictional areas of the Infant and Children's Health
20	Advisory Council shall include all issues that arise in the area of
21	health care for infants and children and such other areas as
22	designated by the State Board of Health.
23	F. 1. All members of the Advancement of Wellness Advisory
24	Council shall be knowledgeable of issues that arise in the area of

1	advancin	g the	heal	th of all Oklahomans. The Advancement of Wellness

- 2. The jurisdictional areas of the Advancement of Wellness Advisory Council shall include all issues that arise in the areas of tobacco usage and cessation, organ and tissue donation, the requirements for a city or town in the state to be designated as a certified healthy community, the requirements for a business to be designated as a certified healthy business and such other areas as designated by the State Board of Health.
- G. 1. All members of the Home Care and, Hospice and Palliative

 Care Advisory Council shall be knowledgeable of issues that arise in

 the administration and practice of home care and, hospice and

 palliative care services. The Home Care and, Hospice and Palliative

 Care Advisory Council shall be composed as follows:
 - a. the Governor shall appoint:
 - (1) one member who is the owner or administrator of an entity licensed in accordance with the Oklahoma Hospice Licensing Act, and
 - (2) one member who is an owner or administrator of an entity licensed in accordance with the Oklahoma

 Home Care Act,
 - b. the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint:

1	(1) one member who is an owner or administrator of an
2	entity licensed in accordance with the Oklahoma
3	Hospice Licensing Act, and
4	(2) one member who is an owner or administrator of an
5	entity licensed in accordance with the Oklahoma
6	Home Care Act, <u>and</u>
7	(3) one member who is a member of the palliative care
8	patient advocacy community,
9	c. the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
10	appoint:
11	(1) one member representing the public who is or was
12	a legal guardian of a recipient of hospice
13	services, and
14	(2) one member representing the public who is a
15	recipient or legal guardian of a recipient of
16	services from a home health agency, and
17	(3) one member who is an allopathic or osteopathic
18	physician or nurse certified in palliative care
19	delivery in this state, and
20	d. the State Board of Health shall appoint one member
21	representing an association which advocates on behalf
22	of home care or hospice issues.
23	2. The jurisdictional areas of the Home Care and, Hospice and
24	Palliative Care Advisory Council shall include all issues that arise

in the areas of home care or, hospice services, and palliative care, including, but not limited to:

- a. identifying methods that improve the quality and delivery of home care, hospice and palliative care,
- <u>b.</u> reviewing best practices from home care, hospice and palliative care programs in the state,
- c. developing information on home care, hospice and palliative care issues for the general public, and
- $\underline{\text{d.}}$ such other areas as designated by the State Board of Health.
- H. In addition to other powers and duties assigned to each Advisory Council pursuant to this section, each Advisory Council, within its jurisdictional area, shall:
- 1. Have authority to recommend to the State Board of Health rules on behalf of the State Department of Health. The State Department of Health shall not have standing to recommend to the State Board of Health permanent rules or changes to such rules within the jurisdiction of an Advisory Council which have not been submitted previously to the appropriate Advisory Council for action;
- 2. Before recommending any permanent rules to the State Board of Health, give public notice, offer an opportunity for public comment and conduct a public rulemaking hearing when required by the Administrative Procedures Act;

- 3. Have the authority to make nonbinding written
 recommendations to the State Board of Health and/or to the State
 Department of Health which have been concurred upon by at least a
 majority of the membership of the Advisory Council;
 - 4. Have the authority to provide a public forum for the discussion of issues it considers relevant to its area of jurisdiction, and to:
 - a. pass nonbinding resolutions expressing the sense of the Advisory Council, and
 - b. make recommendations to the State Board of Health or the State Department of Health concerning the need and the desirability of conducting meetings, workshops and seminars; and
 - 5. Cooperate with each other Advisory Council, the public, the State Board of Health and the Commissioner of Health in order to coordinate the rules within their respective jurisdictional areas and to achieve maximum efficiency and effectiveness in furthering the objectives of the State Department of Health.
 - I. The Advisory Councils shall not recommend rules for promulgation by the State Board of Health unless all applicable requirements of the Administrative Procedures Act have been followed, including but not limited to notice, rule-impact statement and rulemaking hearings.

1	J. Members of the Advisory Councils shall serve without
2	compensation but may be reimbursed expenses incurred in the
3	performance of their duties, as provided in the State Travel
4	Reimbursement Act. The Advisory Councils are authorized to utilize
5	the conference rooms of the State Department of Health and obtain
6	administrative assistance from the State Department of Health, as
7	required.
8	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
