14 AMENDMENT NO. 1. Page 1, strike the title, enacting clause and  
15 entire bill and insert

16 "An Act relating to schools; defining term; requiring  
17 biennial administration of the Oklahoma Prevention  
18 Needs Assessment Survey beginning in certain school  
19 year; providing for assistance by the Department of  
20 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services; allowing  
alternative survey; directing administration of  
survey subject to certain funding; allowing for  
promulgation of rules; providing for codification;  
and providing an effective date.

22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

1 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 24-157 of Title 70, unless there  
3 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 A. The "Oklahoma Prevention Needs Assessment Survey" means the  
5 biennial mental health prevention survey of public school students  
6 in grades six, eight, ten and twelve managed by the Department of  
7 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services.

8 B. Beginning in the 2022-2023 school year, and biennially  
9 thereafter, public schools shall administer the Oklahoma Prevention  
10 Needs Assessment Survey, or an alternative survey as provided in  
11 subsection D of this section, for the purpose of providing direction  
12 to schools, school districts and communities to effectively improve  
13 the lives of students regarding a variety of issues with a focus on  
14 alcohol, tobacco, other drug use, mental health, academic failure  
15 and violence.

16 C. The Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services  
17 shall maintain the Oklahoma Prevention Needs Assessment Survey and  
18 shall provide technical assistance for schools in survey  
19 administration, reporting, planning and development of school mental  
20 health prevention and intervention strategies informed by the survey  
21 results.

22 D. If a school or school district chooses to administer an  
23 alternative survey or assessment tool to fulfill the purpose  
24 described in subsection B of this section, it may apply for a waiver

1 through the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse  
2 Services.

3 E. The provisions of this section shall be subject to the  
4 availability of federal funding. If federal funding is insufficient  
5 to provide the Oklahoma Prevention Needs Assessment Survey to public  
6 schools on a biennial basis, administration of the survey shall not  
7 be required.

8 F. The Board of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services and  
9 the State Board of Education may promulgate rules as necessary to  
10 carry out the provisions of this section.

11 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021."

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 24-157 of Title 70, unless there  
17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 A. The "Oklahoma Prevention Needs Assessment Survey" means the  
19 biennial mental health prevention survey of public school students  
20 in grades six, eight, ten and twelve managed by the Department of  
21 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services.

22 B. Beginning in the 2022-2023 school year, and biennially  
23 thereafter, public schools shall administer the Oklahoma Prevention  
24 Needs Assessment Survey, or alternative survey as provided in  
subsection D of this section, for the purpose of providing direction

1 to schools, school districts and communities to effectively improve  
2 the lives of students regarding a variety of issues with a focus on  
3 alcohol, tobacco, other drug use, mental health, academic failure  
4 and violence.

5 C. The Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services  
6 shall maintain the Oklahoma Prevention Needs Assessment Survey and  
7 shall provide technical assistance for schools in survey  
8 administration, reporting, planning and development of school mental  
9 health prevention and intervention strategies informed by the survey  
10 results.

11 D. If a school or school district chooses to administer an  
12 alternative survey or assessment tool to fulfill the purpose  
13 described in subsection B of this section, it may apply for a waiver  
14 through the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse  
15 Services.

16 E. The Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services  
17 and the State Department of Education may promulgate rules as  
18 necessary to carry out the provisions of this section.

19 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
