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11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
12	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 68 O.S. 2011, Section 1357.6, is
13	amended to read as follows:
14	Section 1357.6 A. Effective July 1, 1992, there are hereby
15	exempted from the tax levied by Section 1351 et seq. of $_{ au}$ this title
16	sales of drugs for the treatment of human beings, medical
17	appliances, medical devices and other medical equipment including
18	but not limited to corrective eyeglasses, contact lenses, hearing
19	aids, prosthetic devices, as defined in subsection C of this
20	section, durable medical equipment, as defined in subsection D of
21	this section, and mobility enhancing equipment, as defined in
22	subsection E of this section, when administered $\frac{\partial \mathbf{r}_{i}}{\partial \mathbf{r}_{i}}$ distributed <u>or</u>
23	prescribed by a practitioner, as defined in subsection B of this
24	section, who is authorized by law to administer $\frac{\partial \mathbf{r}_{i}}{\partial \mathbf{r}_{i}}$ distribute <u>or</u>

1 prescribe such items or when purchased or leased by or on behalf of 2 an individual for use by such individual under a prescription or 3 work order of a practitioner who is authorized by law to prescribe 4 such items and when the cost of such items will be reimbursed under 5 the Medicare or Medicaid Program.

B. The term "practitioner" means a physician, <u>allopathic</u>
<u>physician</u>, osteopathic physician, surgeon, podiatrist, chiropractor,
optometrist, pharmacist, psychologist, ophthalmologist, nurse
practitioner, <u>clinical nurse specialist</u>, audiologist or hearing aid
dealer or fitter who is licensed by the state as required by law.

11 C. The term "prosthetic device" means a replacement, corrective 12 or supportive device, including repair and replacement parts for 13 same, worn on or in the body to:

Artificially replace a missing portion of the body;
 Prevent or correct physical deformity or malfunction; or

16 3. Support a weak or deformed portion of the body.

Provided, the term shall not include corrective eyeglasses,contact lenses or hearing aids.

D. The term "durable medical equipment" means equipment,including repair and replacement parts for same, which:

21 1. Can withstand repeated use;

22 2. Is primarily and customarily used to serve a medical23 purpose;

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13. Generally is not useful to a person in the absence of2illness or injury; and

4. Is not worn in or on the body.

4 The term "durable medical equipment" shall not include "mobility 5 enhancing equipment" as defined in subsection E of this section.

E. The term "mobility enhancing equipment" means equipment,including repair and replacement parts for same, which:

8 1. Is primarily and customarily used to provide or increase the
9 ability to move from one place to another and which is appropriate
10 for use either in a home or a motor vehicle;

Is not generally used by persons with normal mobility; and
 Does not include any motor vehicle or equipment on a motor
 vehicle normally provided by a motor vehicle manufacturer.

14 The term "mobility enhancing equipment" shall not include 15 "durable medical equipment" as defined in subsection D of this 16 section.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.

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
