An Act relating to telemedicine; amending 36 O.S. 2011, Section 6802, which relates to telemedicine;
defining term; amending 43A O.S. 2011, Section 1-103, as last amended by Section 29, Chapter 475, O.S.L.
2019 (43A O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 1-103), which relates to definitions; defining term; amending
Section 1, Chapter 228, O.S.L. 2017 (59 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 478), which relates to telemedicine;
defining term; and providing an effective date.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 36 O.S. 2011, Section 6802, is
amended to read as follows:
Section 6802. As used in this act, "telemedicine" means the
practice of health care delivery, diagnosis, consultation,
treatment, including, but not limited to, the treatment and
prevention of strokes, transfer of medical data, or exchange of
medical education information by means of audio, video, or data
communications. Telemedicine is not a includes consultation
provided by telephone or facsimile machine.

1SECTION 2.AMENDATORY43A O.S. 2011, Section 1-103, as2last amended by Section 29, Chapter 475, O.S.L. 2019 (43A O.S. Supp.)32020, Section 1-103), is amended to read as follows:

Section 1-103. When used in this title, unless otherwise
expressly stated, or unless the context or subject matter otherwise
requires:

7 1. "Department" means the Department of Mental Health and
8 Substance Abuse Services;

9 2. "Chair" means the chair of the Board of Mental Health and
10 Substance Abuse Services;

11 3. "Mental illness" means a substantial disorder of thought, 12 mood, perception, psychological orientation or memory that 13 significantly impairs judgment, behavior, capacity to recognize 14 reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life;

4. "Board" means the Board of Mental Health and Substance Abuse
Services as established by the Mental Health Law;

17 5. "Commissioner" means the individual selected and appointed
18 by the Board to serve as Commissioner of Mental Health and Substance
19 Abuse Services;

20 6. "Indigent person" means a person who has not sufficient 21 assets or resources to support the person and to support members of 22 the family of the person lawfully dependent on the person for 23 support;

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7. "Facility" means any hospital, school, building, house or 1 2 retreat, authorized by law to have the care, treatment or custody of an individual with mental illness, or drug or alcohol dependency, 3 gambling addiction τ or eating disorders, or an individual requiring 4 5 an opioid substitution treatment program, including,. Facility includes, but is not limited to, public or private hospitals, 6 7 community mental health centers, clinics, or satellites $\frac{1}{2}$ facilities; provided, that facility shall not mean a child guidance 8 9 center operated by the State Department of Health;

10 8. "Consumer" means a person under care or treatment in a 11 facility pursuant to the Mental Health Law, or in an outpatient 12 status;

9. "Care and treatment" means medical care and behavioral health services, as well as food, clothing and maintenance, furnished to a person;

16 10. Whenever in this law or in any other law, or in any rule or 17 order made or promulgated pursuant to this law or to any other law, 18 or in the printed forms prepared for the admission of consumers or 19 for statistical reports, the words "insane", "insanity", "lunacy", 20 "mentally sick", "mental disease" or "mental disorder" are used, 21 such terms shall have equal significance to the words "mental 22 illness";

23 11. "Licensed mental health professional" means:24

3	b.	a psychiatrist who is a diplomate of the American

9	d.	a clinical psychologist who is duly licensed to
10		practice by the State Board of Examiners of
11		Psychologists,
12	e.	a professional counselor licensed pursuant to the
13		Licensed Professional Counselors Act,
14	f.	a person licensed as a clinical social worker pursuant
15		to the provisions of the Social Worker's Licensing
16		Act,
17	đ.	a licensed marital and family therapist as defined in
18		the Marital and Family Therapist Licensure Act,
19	h.	a licensed behavioral practitioner as defined in the
20		Licensed Behavioral Practitioner Act,
21	i.	an advanced practice nurse as defined in the Oklahoma

23	j.	a physician's assistant who is licensed in good

"Person requiring treatment" means a person who 7 a. because of his or her mental illness or drug or 8 9 alcohol dependency: 10 (1) poses a substantial risk of immediate physical 11 harm to self as manifested by evidence or serious 12 threats of or attempts at suicide or other 13 significant self-inflicted bodily harm, 14 poses a substantial risk of immediate physical (2) 15 harm to another person or persons as manifested 16 by evidence of violent behavior directed toward 17 another person or persons, 18 (3) has placed another person or persons in a 19 reasonable fear of violent behavior directed 20 towards such person or persons or serious 21 physical harm to them as manifested by serious 22 and immediate threats, 23 is in a condition of severe deterioration such (4) 24 that, without immediate intervention, there

1 exists a substantial risk that severe impairment 2 or injury will result to the person, or 3 (5) poses a substantial risk of immediate serious 4 physical injury to self or death as manifested by 5 evidence that the person is unable to provide for 6 and is not providing for his or her basic 7 physical needs. b. The mental health or substance abuse history of the 8 9 person may be used as part of the evidence to 10 determine whether the person is a person requiring 11 treatment or an assisted outpatient. The mental 12 health or substance abuse history of the person shall 13 not be the sole basis for this determination. 14 Unless a person also meets the criteria established in с. 15 subparagraph a or b of this paragraph, "person 16 requiring treatment" or an "assisted outpatient" shall 17 not mean: 18 a person whose mental processes have been (1)19 weakened or impaired by reason of advanced years, 20 dementia, or Alzheimer's disease, 21 (2) a person with intellectual or developmental 22 disability as defined in Title 10 of the Oklahoma 23 Statutes, 24

(3) a person with seizure disorder,

1	(4)	a	person	with	a	traumatic	brain	injury,	or
2	(5)	a	person	who	is	homeless.			

d. A person who meets the criteria established in this
section but who is medically unstable, or the facility
holding the person is unable to treat the additional
medical conditions of that person, should be
discharged and transported in accordance with Section
1-110 of this title;

9 14. "Petitioner" means a person who files a petition alleging 10 that an individual is a person requiring treatment or an assisted 11 outpatient;

12 15. "Executive director" means the person in charge of a 13 facility as defined in this section;

14 16. "Private hospital or facility" means any general hospital 15 maintaining a <u>neuro-psychiatric neuropsychiatric</u> unit or ward, or 16 any private hospital or facility for care and treatment of a person 17 having a mental illness, which is not supported by the state or 18 federal government. The term "private hospital" or "facility" shall 19 not include nursing homes or other facilities maintained primarily 20 for the care of elderly and disabled persons;

21 17. "Individualized treatment plan" means a proposal developed 22 during the stay of an individual in a facility, under the provisions 23 of this title, which is specifically tailored to the treatment needs 24 of the individual. Each plan shall clearly include the following:

- 1 a statement of treatment goals or objectives, based a. 2 upon and related to a clinical evaluation, which can 3 be reasonably achieved within a designated time 4 interval,
- b. treatment methods and procedures to be used to obtain these goals, which methods and procedures are related 7 to each of these goals and which include specific prognosis for achieving each of these goals,
- 9 с. identification of the types of professional personnel 10 who will carry out the treatment procedures, including 11 appropriate medical or other professional involvement 12 by a physician or other health professional properly 13 qualified to fulfill legal requirements mandated under 14 state and federal law,
- 15 d. documentation of involvement by the individual 16 receiving treatment and, if applicable, the accordance 17 of the individual with the treatment plan, and 18 a statement attesting that the executive director of e. 19 the facility or clinical director has made a 20 reasonable effort to meet the plan's individualized 21 treatment goals in the least restrictive environment 22 possible closest to the home community of the 23 individual;
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18. "Telemedicine" means the practice of health care delivery, 1 2 diagnosis, consultation, evaluation, treatment, transfer of medical 3 data, or exchange of medical education information by means of 4 audio, video $_{\tau}$ or data communications. Telemedicine uses audio and 5 video multimedia telecommunication equipment which permits two-way real-time communication between a health care practitioner and a 6 7 patient who are not in the same physical location. Telemedicine shall not include consultation provided by telephone or facsimile 8 9 machine;

10 19. "Recovery and recovery support" means nonclinical services that assist individuals and families to recover from alcohol or drug 11 12 problems. They include social support, linkage to and coordination 13 among allied service providers, including but not limited to 14 transportation to and from treatment or employment, employment 15 services and job training, case management and individual services 16 coordination, life skills education, relapse prevention, housing 17 assistance, child care, and substance abuse education;

18 20. "Assisted outpatient" means a person who:

19a.is either currently under the care of a facility20certified by the Department of Mental Health and21Substance Abuse Services as a Community Mental Health22Center, or is being discharged from the custody of the23Oklahoma Department of Corrections, or is being

3	b.	is suffering from a mental illness,
4	с.	is unlikely to survive safely in the community without
5		supervision, based on a clinical determination,
6	d.	has a history of lack of compliance with treatment for
7		mental illness that has:
8		(1) prior to the filing of a petition, at least twice
9		within the last thirty-six (36) months been a
10		significant factor in necessitating
11		hospitalization or treatment in a hospital or
12		residential facility, including admission to a
13		community-based structured crisis center as
14		certified by the Oklahoma Department of Mental
15		Health and Substance Abuse Services, or receipt
16		of services in a forensic or other mental health
17		unit of a correctional facility, or a specialized
18		treatment plan for treatment of mental illness in
19		a secure juvenile facility or placement in a
20		specialized residential program for juveniles, or
21		(2) prior to the filing of the petition, resulted in
22		one or more acts of serious violent behavior
23		toward self or others or threats of, or attempts
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1 at, serious physical harm to self or others 2 within the last twenty-four (24) months, is, as a result of his or her mental illness, unlikely 3 e. 4 to voluntarily participate in outpatient treatment 5 that would enable him or her to live safely in the 6 community, 7 f. in view of his or her treatment history and current behavior, is in need of assisted outpatient treatment 8 9 in order to prevent a relapse or deterioration which 10 would be likely to result in serious harm to the 11 person or persons as defined in this section, and 12 q. is likely to benefit from assisted outpatient 13 treatment; and

14 21. "Assisted outpatient treatment" means outpatient services 15 which have been ordered by the court pursuant to a treatment plan 16 approved by the court to treat an assisted outpatient's mental 17 illness and to assist the person in living and functioning in the 18 community, or to attempt to prevent a relapse or deterioration that 19 may reasonably be predicted to result in suicide or the need for 20 hospitalization.

SECTION 3. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 228, O.S.L.
2017 (59 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 478), is amended to read as
follows:

24 Section 478. A. As used in this act:

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1. "Store_and_forward technologies" means the transmission of a
 patient's medical information from an originating site to the
 physician or practitioner at the distant site; provided, photographs
 visualized by a telecommunications system shall be specific to the
 patient's medical condition and adequate for furnishing or
 confirming a diagnosis or treatment plan;

7 2. "Telemedicine" means the practice of health care delivery, 8 diagnosis, consultation, evaluation and treatment, transfer of 9 medical data or exchange of medical education information by means 10 of a two-way, real-time interactive communication, not to exclude 11 store_and_forward technologies, between a patient and a physician 12 with access to and reviewing the patient's relevant clinical 13 information prior to the telemedicine visit.

14 "Telemedicine" and "store_and_forward technologies" shall not 15 include consultations provided by telephone audio-only 16 communication, electronic mail, text message, instant messaging 17 conversation, <u>adaptive</u> website questionnaire, <u>nonsecure</u> <u>and secure</u> 18 video conference or facsimile machine.

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 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.

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
