7	An Act relating to alcoholic beverages; creating a
8	delivery service license for delivery of alcoholic beverages; providing requirements to receive a delivery service license; providing actions a
9	delivery service license, ploviding actions a delivery service licensee may or may not undertake; providing delivery service license renewal amount;
10	allowing a delivery service licensee to charge consumers a delivery fee; prohibiting delivery
11	service licensee from charging, adding on, or collecting any portion of the amount of the retail
12	sales price for the alcoholic beverages; prohibiting a retail spirits licensee from using delivery service
13	licensees for the purpose of completing alcoholic beverage product deliveries to consumers; exempting a
14	technology services company from needing a license; granting the Alcoholic Beverage Law Enforcement
15	Commission the ability to enforce this act; prohibiting direct shipment of alcohol, liquor, wine,
16	or beer from any manufacturer; providing nothing shall be construed to authorize the direct shipment
17	of alcohol, liquor, wine, or beer from any manufacturer; providing no person shall use a license
18	or exercise any privileges granted by the license except as provided by the Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage
19	Control Act; providing that no package containing alcoholic beverages may be delivered to or left
20	unattended at a residence or business address; providing that the ABLE Commission is authorized to
21	providing that deliveries authorized by a licensee to
22	be made to a consumer shall be deemed a direct hand- to-hand sale as though the consumer was physically
23	present on the licensed premises and authorized by law; amending 37A O.S. 2021, Sections 2-101 and 2-
24	161, which relate to annual fees and curbside pickup

1 and delivery; providing delivery service license annual fee; providing that a delivery service 2 licensee may transport and deliver alcoholic beverage products; providing that a retail beer or retail wine licensee may sell curbside and deliver; providing 3 that employees or independent contractors of retail beer or retail wine licensees or delivery service 4 licensees shall be licensed to make alcoholic 5 beverage product deliveries; providing that a delivery service licensee shall be held responsible for violations of alcoholic beverage laws or 6 administrative rules of the ABLE Commission; 7 providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency. 8

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10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

11 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 12 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-162 of Title 37A, unless there 13 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

14 Any individual, limited liability company, corporation, or Α. 15 partnership that is registered to do business in this state, regardless of the residency of the ownership of the entity, may 16 17 apply for and be issued a delivery service license that authorizes 18 the licensee to deliver alcoholic beverages from a store holding a 19 retail beer or retail wine license, licensed by the Alcoholic 20 Beverage Law Enforcement (ABLE) Commission to sell alcoholic 21 beverage products, to any person in this state who is at least 22 twenty-one (21) years of age for the individual's personal use and 23 not for resale.

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B. To receive a delivery service license, an applicant shall do all of the following:

3 1. Apply for an application with the Alcoholic Beverage Law4 Enforcement (ABLE) Commission;

5 2. Provide to the ABLE Commission a sample contract that the 6 applicant intends to enter into with a retail beer or retail wine 7 licensee for the delivery of alcoholic beverage products, unless the 8 applicant is the holder of a retail beer or retail wine license or 9 operates under the same parent company as the retail beer or retail 10 wine license holder;

Submit to the ABLE Commission an outline of internal or
 external training for delivery service personnel that addresses
 topics such as identifying underage persons, intoxicated persons,
 and fake or altered identification;

15 4. Provide an attestation that the applicant is at least 16 twenty-one (21) years of age and has not been convicted of a felony 17 in any state or federal court;

18 5. Provide proof of a general liability insurance policy in an 19 amount not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per 20 occurrence; and

21 6. Be properly registered to conduct business in Oklahoma.

22 C. A delivery service licensee:

May contract with any retail beer or retail wine licensee,
 licensed to sell alcoholic beverage products for off-premises

1 consumption, for the purpose of delivering alcoholic beverage
2 products;

2. May use its own employees or independent contractors who are
at least twenty-one (21) years of age to deliver such alcoholic
beverage products, provided such delivery service personnel shall
not have been convicted of any criminal offense relating to
alcoholic beverages. The delivery service licensee shall complete a
criminal history records check on each delivery driver who delivers
alcoholic beverages for a licensee;

10 3. May facilitate orders by telephone, Internet, or by other 11 electronic means for the sale and delivery of alcoholic beverages. 12 If payment is not received at the time of order, the delivery 13 service licensee may act as an agent of the retail licensee in the 14 collection of payments from the sale of alcoholic beverages, but the 15 full amount of each order must be handled in a manner that gives the 16 retail licensee control over the ultimate receipt of the payment 17 from the consumer with the retail licensee operating as the merchant 18 The retail beer or retail wine licensee shall remain of record. 19 responsible for the proper remittance of all applicable taxes on the 20 sale of the product;

4. Shall deliver only sealed containers of alcoholic beverage
products;

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Shall obtain from the consumer a confirmation that he or she
 is at least twenty-one (21) years of age at the time the order is
 placed;

6. Shall require the recipient, at the time of delivery, to
provide valid photo identification verifying he or she is at least
twenty-one (21) years of age and sign for the delivery;

7 7. Shall possess identification scanning software technology or
8 a state-of-the-art alternative at the point of delivery to
9 authenticate that the recipient is at least twenty-one (21) years of
10 age, and collect the recipient's name and date of birth;

11 8. Shall return all alcoholic beverages to the retail beer or 12 retail wine licensee if the recipient is under twenty-one (21) years 13 of age, appears intoxicated, fails to provide proof of 14 identification, fails or refuses to sign for delivery, fails to 15 complete the identity verification process, declines to accept the 16 delivery of alcoholic beverages or beer, or if any circumstances in 17 the delivery environment indicate illegal conduct, overconsumption, 18 or an otherwise unsafe environment for the consumption of alcohol. 19 Such return shall occur on the same business day;

9. May not deliver any alcoholic beverage to any person located
within a dry jurisdiction in Oklahoma;

22 10. Shall pick up alcoholic beverages for delivery only during 23 lawful sales hours in that jurisdiction for the retail beer or

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retail wine licensee holder, provided that orders may be delivered
 and completed on the same day within a reasonable time thereafter;

11. Shall permit the ABLE Commission to perform an audit of the
licensee's records upon request and with sufficient notification;
12. Shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of
the ABLE Commission and the Oklahoma courts concerning enforcement
of this section and any related laws or rules; and

8 13. Shall be responsible for delivery of alcoholic beverage9 products as provided in this act and by rule.

D. A delivery service licensee may renew its license with the ABLE Commission by maintaining all qualifications, paying annually a renewal fee of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), and providing the Commission with a true copy of its current license. The annual fee for delivery service licensees shall be collected by the ABLE Commission for deposit and credit to the General Revenue Fund of this state.

E. A delivery service licensee shall be authorized to charge
the consumer a delivery fee but shall not charge, add on, or collect
any portion of the amount of the retail sales price for the
alcoholic beverages.

F. A retail spirits licensee shall be prohibited from using delivery service licensees for the purpose of completing alcoholic beverage product deliveries to consumers.

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1 G. Nothing in this act shall be construed to require a 2 technology services company to obtain a delivery service license if the company does not employ or contract with delivery agents, but 3 merely provides software or a digital network application that 4 5 connects consumers and retail beer or retail wine licensee for the delivery of alcoholic beverages from the retail beer or retail wine 6 7 licensee. However, the act of connecting consumers to retail beer or retail wine licensees shall serve to grant jurisdiction to the 8 9 State of Oklahoma.

H. The ABLE Commission may enforce the requirements of this section by the same administrative procedures that apply to all other alcoholic beverage licensees.

13 Ι. The ABLE Commission may enforce the requirements of this 14 section against any employee or independent contractor of a retail 15 beer or retail wine licensee or delivery service licensee, irrespective of the status of any delivery service personnel as an 16 17 independent contractor or employee. Delivery to a minor shall be 18 treated as furnishing to a minor and shall result in any applicable disciplinary action, provided that the retail beer or retail wine 19 20 licensee shall not be held liable for violations that occur after 21 transferring possession of the alcoholic beverage product to the 22 delivery service licensee.

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J. Nothing in this act shall be construed to authorize the direct shipment of alcohol, liquor, wine, or beer from any manufacturer.

K. No person shall use a license or exercise any privileges
granted by the license except as provided by the Oklahoma Alcoholic
Beverage Control Act.

L. No package containing alcoholic beverages may be delivered
to or left unattended at a residence or business address except for
the delivery of such package in person to the purchaser confirmed to
be twenty-one (21) years of age or older.

M. The ABLE Commission is authorized to promulgate rules, regulations, forms, and procedures necessary to implement and enforce the provisions of this section.

N. For purposes of this section, each delivery authorized by a licensee to be made to a consumer shall be deemed a direct hand-tohand sale as though the consumer was physically present on the licensed premises and authorized by law by such licensee.

11 There shall be added to the fee for a Mixed Beverage/Caterer 2. 12 Combination License an administrative fee, which shall not be deemed 13 to be a license fee, in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars 14 (\$250.00), which shall be paid at the same time and in the same 15 manner as the license fee prescribed by paragraph 13 of subsection A 16 of this section.

17 C. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection A of this 18 section:

19 1. The license fee for a mixed beverage or bottle club license 20 for those service organizations or fraternal beneficiary societies 21 which are exempt under Section 501(c)(19), (8) or (10) of the 22 Internal Revenue Code shall be Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per 23 year; and

2. The renewal fee for an airline/railroad/commercial passenger
 vessel beverage license held by a railroad described in 49 U.S.C.,
 Section 24301, shall be One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).

4 D. An applicant may apply for and receive both an on-premises5 beer and wine license and a caterer license.

E. All licenses, except as otherwise provided, shall be valid
for one (1) year from date of issuance unless revoked or
surrendered. Provided, all employee licenses shall be valid for two
(2) years.

10 The holder of a license, issued by the ABLE Commission, for F. a bottle club located in a county of this state where the sale of 11 alcoholic beverages by the individual drink for on-premises 12 13 consumption has been authorized, may exchange the bottle club 14 license for a mixed beverage license or an on-premises beer and wine 15 license and operate the licensed premises as a mixed beverage 16 establishment or an on-premises beer and wine establishment subject 17 to the provisions of the Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage Control Act. 18 There shall be no additional fee for such exchange and the mixed 19 beverage license or on-premises beer and wine license issued shall 20 expire one (1) year from the date of issuance of the original bottle 21 club license.

G. In addition to the applicable licensing fee, the following surcharge shall be assessed annually on the following licenses:

Any license issued by the ABLE Commission under this title may be relied upon by other licensees as a valid license, and no other licensee shall have any obligation to independently determine the validity of such license or be held liable solely as a consequence of another licensee's failure to maintain a valid license.

13SECTION 3.AMENDATORY37A O.S. 2021, Section 2-161, is14amended to read as follows:

Section 2-161. A. Retail spirit licensees may sell curbside and deliver alcoholic beverages including beer, wine, and spirits in sealed original containers to consumers aged twenty-one (21) years and older as follows:

19 1. Only employees of the retail spirit licensee shall be 20 permitted to make alcoholic beverage product deliveries to 21 consumers;

22 2. Payment for alcoholic beverage product delivery by the 23 retail spirit licensee may be made by cash, check, transportable 24

1 credit/debit card processors or advance on-line online payment
2 methods; and

3 3. The retail spirit licensee shall be responsible for his or
4 her delivery employees as provided in Section 2-133 of Title 37A of
5 the Oklahoma Statutes this title.

B. Small brewers and small farm wineries licensed by the
Oklahoma ABLE Commission may sell curbside only alcoholic beverages
produced by such licensee in sealed original containers to consumers
aged twenty-one (21) years and older as follows:

Only employees of the licensed small brewer or small farm
 winery shall be permitted to make alcoholic beverage product
 deliveries to consumers;

Payment for alcoholic beverage product delivery by licensed
 small brewers or small farm wineries may be made by cash, check,
 transportable credit/debit card processors, or advance on-line
 online payment methods; and

3. Small brewers and small farm wineries shall be responsible
for their delivery employees as provided in Section 2-133 of Title
37A of the Oklahoma Statutes this title.

C. Restaurants, bars and clubs holding mixed beverage, beer and wine, or caterer/mixed beverage licenses issued by the Oklahoma ABLE Commission may sell curbside and deliver only closed packages of beer and wine to consumers aged twenty-one (21) years and older as follows:

1. Only employees of such restaurant, bar or club licensee
 2 shall be permitted to make alcoholic beverage package deliveries to
 3 consumers;

2. Payment for alcoholic beverage package delivery by licensed
restaurants, bars and clubs may be made by cash, check,
transportable credit/debit card processors, or advance on-line
online payment methods; and

8 3. Restaurants, bars and clubs licensed by the Oklahoma ABLE
9 Commission shall be responsible for their delivery employees as
10 provided in Section 2-133 of Title 37A of the Oklahoma Statutes this
11 title.

D. Grocery and convenience stores holding a retail beer and/or retail wine license issued by the Oklahoma ABLE Commission may sell curbside and deliver original sealed containers of beer and/or wine only according to the license held to consumers aged twenty-one (21) years and older as follows:

Only employees of such licensed grocery or convenience store
 shall be permitted to make alcoholic beverage product deliveries to
 consumers;

2. Payment for alcoholic beverage product delivery by a
 21 licensed grocery or convenience store may be made by cash, check,
 22 transportable credit/debit card processors or advance on-line online
 23 payment methods; and

Grocery and convenience store licensees shall be responsible
 for their delivery employees as provided in Section 2-133 of Title
 37A of the Oklahoma Statutes this title.

E. Licensees authorized by this section to make alcoholic
beverage product deliveries to consumers are prohibited from
utilizing third-party vendors or delivery services for purposes of
completing such product deliveries to consumers.

8 F. Licensees authorized by this section to make alcoholic
9 beverage product deliveries to consumers shall comply with the laws,
10 rules, procedures and executive orders incumbent on such licensee.

G. The Oklahoma ABLE Commission is authorized to promulgate rules, regulations, forms and procedures necessary to implement and enforce the provisions of this section.

H. For purposes of this section each delivery authorized by a licensee to be made by his or her employee shall be deemed a direct hand-to-hand sale as though the consumer was physically present on the licensed premises and authorized by law by such licensee.

18 <u>I. Notwithstanding any law or rule to the contrary, a delivery</u> 19 <u>service licensee, or an employee or independent contractor of a</u> 20 <u>delivery service licensee, in accordance with Section 1 of this act,</u> 21 <u>may transport and deliver alcoholic beverage products, including</u> 22 <u>curbside, from a retail beer or retail wine licensees to consumers</u> 23 <u>aged twenty-one (21) years and older for the consumer's personal use</u> 24 and not for resale.

1	J. Employees or independent contractors of licensed grocery
2	stores or convenience stores or delivery service licensees shall be
3	permitted to make alcoholic beverage product deliveries to consumers
4	aged twenty-one (21) years and older for the consumer's personal use
5	and not for resale.
6	K. A delivery service licensee who is authorized by law and by
7	contractual agreement with a grocery or convenience store licensee
8	to deliver alcoholic beverage products to a consumer shall be held
9	responsible for violations of alcoholic beverage laws or
10	administrative rules of the ABLE Commission affecting his or her
11	license privilege to deliver alcoholic beverage products to
12	<u>consumers.</u>
13	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.
14	SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
15	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
16	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
17	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
