AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 130.13, as 17 renumbered by Section 17, Chapter 328, O.S.L. 2014 (40 O.S. Supp. 18 2014, Section 142.5), is amended to read as follows: 19 Section 142.5 As used in the Alternative Fuels Technician 20 Certification Act: 21 1. "Alternative fuels" means liquefied petroleum gas, natural 22 gas and liquid fuels produced from natural gas, methanol, ethanol, 23 electricity, coal-derived liquid fuels, hydrogen, biodiesel and 24 fuels derived from biological materials; HB1728 HFLR

2. "Alternative fuels equipment technician" means any person
 who installs, modifies, repairs or renovates equipment used in the
 conversion of any engines to engines fueled by alternative fuels.
 This includes originally equipped manufactured engines dedicated to
 operate on an alternative fuel;

3. "Alternative fuels compression technician" means any person
who installs, services, modifies, repairs or renovates fill
stations;

9 4. "Board" means the Alternative Fuels Technician Hearing
10 Board;

11 5. "Committee" means the Committee of Alternative Fuels
12 Technician Examiners;

13 <u>5. "Compressed natural gas vehicular fuel system" means an</u> 14 <u>object or objects mounted, installed, attached or otherwise placed</u> 15 <u>upon or within a vehicle or vehicle trailer to supply or assist in</u> 16 <u>the supply of compressed natural gas as a fuel to an internal</u> 17 combustion engine or engines;

6. "Electric vehicle technician" means any person who installs, modifies, repairs, performs maintenance on, or renovates onboard charging systems, motors, controllers, power sources, or the drive systems of vehicles powered by electricity that is greater than eighty (80) volts. This includes vehicles originally equipped as electric vehicles, vehicles converted from gliders, and vehicles converted from internal combustion engine vehicles;

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7. "Fill station" means the equipment and conveyance property
 that provides the delivery and, if required, compression of an
 alternative fuel other than electricity; and

8. "Glider" means a vehicle built without an engine or fuel
system for the purpose of converting it to an electric vehicle.
SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 130.14, as
last amended by Section 4, Chapter 328, O.S.L. 2014, and as
renumbered by Section 18, Chapter 328, O.S.L. 2014 (40 O.S. Supp.
2014, Section 142.6), is amended to read as follows:

10 Section 142.6 A. There is hereby established the Committee of 11 Alternative Fuels Technician Examiners which shall consist of eight 12 (8) members. All members of the Committee shall be residents of 13 this state.

B. Five voting members of the Committee shall be appointed by the Commissioner of Labor as follows:

Three members shall be alternative fuels technicians
 selected from a list of names submitted by the State Board of Career
 and Technology Education, with at least one member being an
 alternative fuels equipment technician and at least one member being
 an alternative fuels compression technician;

21 2. One member shall be a person involved in compressed natural 22 gas technology in an oil and/or gas industry; and

23 3. One member shall be a person involved in liquefied petroleum
24 gas technology in an oil and/or gas industry.

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C. Two additional voting members shall be appointed by the
 Commissioner of Labor, one of whom shall be selected from a list of
 names submitted by the State Board of Career and Technology
 Education and shall be an electric vehicle technician, and one of
 whom shall be a person involved in manufacturing, conversion, or
 research in the electric vehicle industry.

D. All members shall each have at least two (2) years of active experience in alternative fuels technology. The terms of the voting members initially appointed to the Committee shall be staggered as follows:

One alternative fuels technician shall be appointed for a
 term of two (2) years;

One alternative fuels technician shall be appointed for a
 term of three (3) years;

15 3. One alternative fuels technician shall be appointed for a
16 term of four (4) years;

4. One person involved in compressed natural gas technology in an oil and/or gas industry shall be appointed for a term of three (3) years;

20 5. One person involved in liquefied petroleum gas technology in 21 an oil and/or gas industry shall be appointed for a term of four (4) 22 years;

23 6. One electric vehicle technician shall be appointed for a
24 term of two (2) years; and

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7. One person involved in manufacturing, conversion, or
 research in the electric vehicle industry shall be appointed for a
 term of three (3) years.

4 Thereafter, each voting member of the Committee shall be 5 appointed for a term of five (5) years, or until their successors 6 are appointed and qualified.

7 The nonvoting member shall be designated by the Commissioner of 8 Labor to serve as Program Administrator and Recording Secretary to 9 the Committee.

10 E. Vacancies which may occur in the membership of the Committee 11 shall be filled by appointment of the Commissioner of Labor. Each 12 person who has been appointed to fill a vacancy shall serve for the 13 remainder of the term for which the member such person succeeds was 14 appointed and until a successor has been appointed and has 15 qualified. Members of the Committee may be removed from office by 16 the Commissioner of Labor for cause in the manner provided by law 17 for the removal of officers not subject to impeachment.

F. The Committee shall assist and advise the Commissioner of Labor on all matters relating to the formulation of rules and standards in accordance with the Alternative Fuels Technician Certification Act. The Committee Commissioner of Labor or designee shall administer the examinations of applicants for certification as alternative fuels equipment technicians, alternative fuels compression technicians, and electric vehicle technicians provided

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1 that such examinations shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Alternative Fuels Technician Certification Act. 2

G. All members of the Committee shall be reimbursed for 3 4 expenses incurred while in the performance of their duties in 5 accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

A majority of the total membership of the Committee shall 6 н. constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. 7

SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 130.15, as 8 9 last amended by Section 5, Chapter 328, O.S.L. 2014, and as 10 renumbered by Section 19, Chapter 328, O.S.L. 2014 (40 O.S. Supp. 11 2014, Section 142.7), is amended to read as follows:

Section 142.7 A. Examinations for certification as alternative 12 13 fuels equipment technicians shall be uniform and practical in nature 14 for alternative fuels equipment technician certification and shall 15 be sufficiently strict to test the qualifications and fitness of the 16 applicants for certificates.

17 Β. Examinations for certification as alternative fuels 18 compression technicians shall be uniform and practical in nature for 19 alternative fuels compression technician certification and shall be 20 sufficiently strict to test the qualifications and fitness of the 21 applicants for certificates.

22 C. Examinations for certification as electric vehicle 23 technicians shall be uniform and practical in nature for electric 24 vehicle technician certification and shall be sufficiently strict to HB1728 HFLR Page 7

1 test the qualifications and fitness of the applicants for 2 certificates.

3 D. Examinations shall be in whole or in part in writing. The 4 Committee shall conduct examinations twice a year and at such other 5 times as it deems necessary. Any applicant initially failing to pass the examination shall not be permitted to take another 6 7 examination for a period of thirty (30) days. Any applicant subsequently failing to pass the examination shall not be permitted 8 9 to take another examination for a period of ninety (90) thirty (30) 10 days.

11 Ε. The Department of Labor shall enforce the provisions of this 12 section.

13 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 130.16, as 14 last amended by Section 6, Chapter 328, O.S.L. 2014, and as 15 renumbered by Section 20, Chapter 328, O.S.L. 2014 (40 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 142.8), is amended to read as follows: 16

17 Section 142.8 A. The Department of Labor shall issue a 18 certificate as an alternative fuels equipment technician to any 19 person who:

20 Has been licensed by the Oklahoma Liquefied Petroleum Gas 1. 21 Board and has successfully passed the appropriate examination as 22 provided in the Alternative Fuels Technician Certification Act; or 23 2. Has has been certified by the Committee as either having 24 successfully passed the appropriate examination or having a valid HB1728 HFLR

1 license or certificate issued by another governmental entity with 2 licensing or certification requirements similar to those provided in 3 the Alternative Fuels Technician Certification Act; and

3. <u>2.</u> Has paid the certification fee and otherwise complied
with the provisions of the Alternative Fuels Technician
Certification Act; and

7 4. Has provided proof of liability insurance with limits of not
8 less than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) general liability.

9 B. The Department of Labor shall issue a certificate as an
10 alternative fuels compression technician to any person who:

Has successfully passed the appropriate examination as
 provided in the Alternative Fuels Technician Certification Act or
 has been certified by the Committee as having a valid license or
 certificate issued by another governmental entity with licensing or
 certification requirements similar to those provided in the
 Alternative Fuels Technician Certification Act; and

17 2. Has paid the certification fee and otherwise complied with
18 the provisions of the Alternative Fuels Technician Certification
19 Act; and

3. Has provided proof of liability insurance with limits of not
less than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) general liability.
C. The Department of Labor shall issue a certificate as an

23 electric vehicle technician to any person who:

24

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1 1. Has been certified by the Committee as either having 2 successfully passed the appropriate examination or having a valid 3 license or certificate issued by another governmental entity with 4 licensing or certification requirements similar to those provided in 5 the Alternative Fuels Technician Certification Act; and

2. Has paid the certification fee and otherwise complied with 6 7 the provisions of the Alternative Fuels Technician Certification Act; and 8

9 3. Has provided proof of liability insurance with limits of not 10 less than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) general liability.

11 D. In the case of a company, partnership or corporation engaged 12 in the business of installing, servicing, repairing, modifying or 13 renovating equipment used in the conversion of engines to engines 14 fueled by alternative fuels, a separate certificate shall be issued 15 by the Department of Labor to that individual company, partnership 16 or corporation. This certificate is for the express purpose of 17 recognizing that the company, partnership or corporation is an 18 authorized alternative fuels conversion business and employs state-19 certified alternative fuels equipment technicians. Any violations 20 by a certified alternative fuels equipment technician shall be 21 deemed a violation by the certified company, partnership or 22 corporation employing such certified technician. A company, 23 partnership or corporation engaged in the business of installing, 24 servicing, repairing, modifying or renovating equipment used in the HB1728 HFLR

1 conversion of engines to engines fueled by alternative fuels shall 2 provide the Department of Labor with proof of liability insurance 3 with limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) 4 general liability.

5 Ε. In the case of a company, partnership or corporation engaged in the business of installing, servicing, repairing, modifying or 6 7 renovating fill stations, a separate certificate shall be issued by the Department of Labor to that individual company, partnership or 8 9 corporation. This certificate is for the express purpose of 10 recognizing that the company, partnership or corporation is an 11 authorized fill station installation business and employs state-12 certified alternative fuels compression technicians or electric 13 vehicle technicians. Any violations by a certified alternative 14 fuels compression technician or electric vehicle technician shall be 15 deemed a violation by the certified company, partnership or 16 corporation employing such certified technician. A company, 17 partnership or corporation engaged in the business of installing, 18 servicing, repairing, modifying or renovating fill stations shall 19 provide the Department of Labor with proof of liability insurance 20 with limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) 21 general liability.

22 In conjunction with subsection A of this section, the F. 23 Department of Labor shall issue an Alternative Fuels Equipment 24 Installation Certification to any public entity or private company, HB1728 HFLR

1 partnership or corporation that operates commercial, private or public fleets of vehicles and employs ten or more auto service 2 3 technicians per location. The certification shall be based on the ability of the applicant to provide their own alternative fuels 4 5 equipment technician training program which shall be certified by the Department of Labor, Committee of Alternative Fuels Technician 6 7 Examiners. This subsection shall not apply to allow certification of any alternative fuels compression technician training programs. 8

9 G. All alternative fuels equipment technician certificates, 10 alternative fuels compression technician certificates, and electric 11 vehicle technician certificates shall be nontransferable and it 12 shall be unlawful for any person certified pursuant to the 13 provisions of the Alternative Fuels Technician Certification Act to 14 loan or allow the use of such certificate by any other person, 15 except as specifically provided in the Alternative Fuels Technician 16 Certification Act.

17 Η. The standards for the storage and handling of liquefied 18 petroleum gases adopted by the National Fire Protection Association 19 and published in the latest edition of its Pamphlet No. 58 and the 20 in the codes adopted by the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code 21 Commission pursuant to the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Act shall 22 be the accepted codes and standards for this state. The standards 23 for the installation of compressed natural gas vehicular fuel 24 systems adopted by the National Fire Protection Association and HB1728 HFLR Page 12

1 published in its Pamphlet No. 52 shall be the accepted standards for 2 this state. The accepted standards for this state for electric 3 vehicle charge stations shall be the National Electric Code (NEC) 4 codes adopted by the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission. The 5 standards for the design, construction, installation, repair, use and inspection of alternative fuel fueling stations, including 6 7 residential fueling appliances and facilities, in the codes adopted by the Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission pursuant to the 8 9 Oklahoma Uniform Building Code Commission Act shall be the accepted 10 codes and standards for this state. The Commissioner of Labor is 11 authorized, and it shall be his or her the duty of the Commissioner 12 to adopt and promulgate such rules or specifications relating to 13 safety in the manufacture, assembly, sale, installation and use of 14 vehicular alternative fuel systems. The Commissioner of Labor is 15 further authorized to modify or amend such rules or specifications 16 as he or she deems reasonable and necessary. I. The Department of Labor may issue an alternative fuels 17 18 trainee certificate to any person who submits a trainee application 19 to the Department within fifteen (15) business days of being hired

20 by a licensed alternative fuels conversion company. An alternative

21 fuels trainee shall be employed by a licensed alternative fuels

22 conversion company located in Oklahoma. A trainee shall work under

23 the direct supervision of a licensed alternative fuels equipment

24 technician. There shall be no more than two alternative fuels

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trainees per licensed alternative fuels equipment technician at any licensed Oklahoma alternative fuels conversion company at any one time. An individual that holds a trainee license may engage in any licensed category pursuant to the Alternative Fuels Technician Certification Act while under the direct supervision of an individual holding the appropriate license in the category of activity being performed.

8 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 130.17, as 9 last amended by Section 7, Chapter 328, O.S.L. 2014, and as 10 renumbered by Section 21, Chapter 328, O.S.L. 2014 (40 O.S. Supp. 11 2014, Section 142.9), is amended to read as follows:

Section 142.9 A. 1. All applications for examination, certification or renewal of certification shall be made in writing to the Department of Labor on forms provided, if necessary, by the Department of Labor. All applications shall be accompanied by the appropriate fee.

17 2. If a person holds a valid Class I Dealer Permit properly
18 issued by the Oklahoma Liquefied Petroleum Gas Board, pursuant to
19 Section 420.4 of Title 52 of the Oklahoma Statutes, the requirements
20 of this section for certification or renewal of certification shall
21 not be required.

The Commissioner of Labor or designee may 12 13 suspend or revoke any license, certificate or registration for cause 14 upon recommendation of the Committee of Alternative Fuels Technician 15 Examiners and shall comply with the provisions of the Administrative 16 Procedures Act. 17 The Commissioner of Labor or designee may, upon the motion Β. 18 of the Commissioner or designee, and shall, upon written complaint 19 filed by any person, investigate the business transactions of any 20 certified alternative fuels equipment or compression technician, or 21 electric vehicle technician. The results of the investigation may 22 be presented to the Committee and the Committee may recommend 23 suspension or revocation of the license, certificate or 24 registration. 1 or revoke any certificate or registration obtained by false or fraudulent representation. The Commissioner of Labor or designee 2 3 shall also suspend or revoke any certificate or registration for any 4 of the following:

5 1. Making a material misstatement in the application for a certificate or registration, or the renewal of a certificate or 6 7 registration;

2. Loaning or illegally using a certificate;

8

9 3. Demonstrating incompetence to act as an alternative fuels 10 equipment technician, alternative fuels compression technician, or electric vehicle technician; 11

12 4. Violating any provisions of the Alternative Fuels Technician 13 Certification Act, or any rule or order prescribed by the Department 14 of Labor; or

15 5. Willfully failing to perform normal business obligations 16 without justifiable cause.

17 Any person whose alternative fuels equipment technician 18 certificate, alternative fuels compression technician certificate, 19 or electric vehicle technician certificate has been revoked by the 20 Commissioner of Labor or designee may apply for a new certificate 21 one (1) year from the date of such revocation.

22 C. Before final action under subsections A and B of this 23 section, the Committee shall provide thirty (30) days written notice 24 to the applicant or licensee involved of the intended action and HB1728 HFLR

1	give sufficient opportunity for the person to request an
2	administrative hearing and to be represented by an attorney. If
3	requested, a hearing shall be scheduled by the Commissioner as
4	provided in the Administrative Procedures Act.
5	D. In the event the Commissioner denies the application for, or
6	revokes or suspends, any certificate or imposes any reprimand, a
7	record of the action shall be in writing and officially signed by
8	the Commissioner. The original copy shall be filed with the
9	Department of Labor and a copy mailed to the affected applicant or
10	licensee within two (2) days of the final action taken by the
11	<u>Commissioner.</u>
12	E. Notice of the suspension or revocation of any license shall
13	be made public record.
14	F. A suspended certificate shall be subject to expiration and
15	may be renewed as provided by the Alternative Fuels Technician
16	Certification Act, regardless of the term of suspension. A renewal
17	of a suspended certificate shall not remove the suspension term.
18	G. Except as otherwise provided, a revoked certificate
19	terminates on the date of revocation and cannot be reinstated. The
20	Commissioner may reverse the revocation action. Any licensee whose
21	certificate is revoked may apply for a new certificate. The
22	licensee shall meet all requirements for a certificate as stated in
23	the Alternative Fuels Technician Certification Act. The Committee
24	may recommend issuance or denial of a new certificate. In

1 determining whether to issue or deny a new certificate, the Committee shall consider, but not be limited to, the nature, 2 3 circumstances, and gravity of the violation or violations leading to 4 revocation, the degree of culpability, and any show of good faith in 5 attempting to achieve compliance with the provisions of the Alternative Fuels Technician Certification Act, and whether the 6 7 applicant has demonstrated good moral character. 1 regulations, bulletins or other documents and the furnishing of 2 copies of the documents to those persons engaged in the alternative 3 fuels industry or the public, and expenses the Department of Labor 4 incurs to support program operations. Warrants for expenditures 5 shall be drawn by the State Treasurer based on claims signed and 6 approved for payment by the Director of the Office of Management and 7 Enterprise Services.

B. All monies received by the Department of Labor under the 8 9 Alternative Fuels Technician Certification Act and derived from the 10 inspection of alternative fuel fill stations and related enforcement 11 actions shall be deposited with the State Treasurer and credited to 12 the "Alternative Fuels Inspection Fees and Fines Revolving Fund". 13 The revolving fund shall be a continuing fund not subject to fiscal 14 year limitations and shall be under the control and management of 15 the Department of Labor. Expenditures from the fund shall be made 16 pursuant to the purposes of the Alternative Fuel Fill Station 17 Inspection and Licensing Program under the Alternative Fuels 18 Technician Certification Act and shall include, but not be limited 19 to, payment of administrative costs and other operational costs 20 supporting the program, payment of costs designed to promote public 21 awareness of the alternative fuels industry, expenditures for the 22 preparation and printing of regulations, bulletins or other 23 documents and the furnishing of copies of the documents to those 24 persons engaged in the alternative fuels industry or the public. HB1728 HFLR

1 Warrants for expenditures shall be drawn by the State Treasurer

2 based on claims signed and approved for payment by the Director of 3 the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.

4 SECTION 8. 74 O.S. 2011, Section 130.23, as AMENDATORY 5 renumbered by Section 27, Chapter 328, O.S.L. 2014 (40 O.S. Supp. 2014, Section 142.15), is amended to read as follows: 6

7 Section 142.15 Any person convicted of violating any provision of the Alternative Fuels Technician Certification Act shall be 8 9 guilty of a misdemeanor. The continued violation of any provision 10 of the Alternative Fuels Technician Certification Act during each 11 day shall be deemed to be a separate offense. Upon conviction 12 thereof the person shall be punished by imprisonment in the county 13 jail not to exceed one (1) year, or by a fine of not more than One 14 Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment 15 for each offense. The Alternative Fuels Technician Hearing Board 16 Commissioner of Labor or designee may request the appropriate 17 district attorney to prosecute such violation and seek an injunction 18 against such practice.

19 SECTION 9. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2011, Section 130.24, as 20 renumbered by Section 28, Chapter 328, O.S.L. 2014 (40 O.S. Supp. 21 2014, Section 142.16), is amended to read as follows:

22 Section 142.16 A. Any person who has been determined by the 23 Alternative Fuels Technician Hearing Board Commissioner of Labor or 24 designee to have violated any provision of the Alternative Fuels HB1728 HFLR

Technician Certification Act or any rule or order issued pursuant to the provisions of the Alternative Fuels Technician Certification Act may be liable for a civil penalty of not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each day that said violation occurs. The maximum civil penalty shall not exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) for any related series of violations.

7 The amount of the penalty shall be assessed by the Board Β. Commissioner of Labor or designee pursuant to the provisions of 8 9 subsection A of this section, after notice and hearing. In 10 determining the amount of the penalty, the Board Commissioner of 11 Labor or designee shall include, but not be limited to, 12 consideration of the nature, circumstances, and gravity of the 13 violation and, with respect to the person found to have committed 14 the violation, the degree of culpability, and any show of good faith 15 in attempting to achieve compliance with the provisions of the 16 Alternative Fuels Technician Certification Act. All monies 17 collected from such civil penalties shall be deposited with the 18 State Treasurer of Oklahoma and placed in the Alternative Fuels 19 Technician Certification Revolving Fund.

20 C. Any certificate holder may elect to surrender his 21 certificate in lieu of said fine but shall be forever barred from 22 obtaining a reissuance of said certificate.

D. In addition to, or in lieu of, the civil penalties set forth

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1	E. Payment for the fines set forth in subsection D of this
2	section shall be due within thirty (30) days of issuance of a

5	Commissioner or designee for an administrative hearing, in writing,
6	within thirty (30) days of issuance of the fine or fines. If
7	requested, the hearing shall then be scheduled by the Commissioner
8	or designee as provided in the Administrative Procedures Act.
9	F. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent
10	revocation or suspension of a certificate pursuant to Section 142.11
11	of this title.
12	SECTION 10. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
13	of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
