A. Any person who shall willfully or maliciously torture, destroy or kill, or cruelly beat or injure, maim or 17 18 mutilate any animal in subjugation or captivity, whether wild or 19 tame, and whether belonging to the person or to another, or deprive 20 any such animal of necessary food, drink, shelter, or veterinary 21 care to prevent suffering; or who shall cause, procure or permit any 22 such animal to be so tortured, destroyed or killed, or cruelly 23 beaten or injured, maimed or mutilated, or deprived of necessary 24 food, drink, shelter, or veterinary care to prevent suffering; or

who shall willfully set on foot, instigate, engage in, or in any way
further any act of cruelty to any animal, or any act tending to
produce such cruelty, shall be guilty of a felony and shall be
punished by imprisonment in the State Penitentiary custody of the
Department of Corrections not exceeding five (5) years, or by
imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding one (1) year, or by a
fine not exceeding Five Thousand Dollars ($5,000.00). Any animal so
maltreated or abused shall be considered an abused or neglected
animal.

B. Any person who shall confine an animal in a motor vehicle or other enclosed space in which the temperature is either so high or so low as to cause serious harm to the animal, without proper ventilation or other protection from such heat or cold, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. Any law enforcement officer or agent of a licensed humane organization may take action necessary to rescue a confined animal endangered by extreme temperatures, and to remove the threat of further serious harm. No officer or agent taking action to remove a confined animal pursuant to this subsection shall be liable for damage reasonably necessary to rescue the confined animal.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2015.
