9 An Act relating to human trafficking and child
10 exploitation; creating the Advisory Task Force on
11 Prevention of Human Trafficking and Child
12 Exploitation; providing for membership and
13 appointments; stating duty to study human
14 trafficking, prostitution and child exploitation in
15 Oklahoma; providing for recommendations and report;
16 stating member appointment and initial meeting dates;
17 setting term for task force; providing travel
18 reimbursements; providing for noncodification;
19 providing an effective date; and declaring an
20 emergency.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

22 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
23 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

24 A. There is hereby created an Advisory Task Force on Prevention
of Human Trafficking and Child Exploitation. There shall be
thirteen (13) members on the Advisory Task Force as follows:

1. The Cabinet Secretary of Public Safety, or designee;

- 1 2. The Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation,
2 or a designee;
- 3 3. The Attorney General, or a designee;
- 4 4. The Chair of the District Attorneys Council, or a designee;
- 5 5. The Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and
6 Dangerous Drugs Control, or a designee;
- 7 6. The Director of the Department of Human Services, or a
8 designee;
- 9 7. The Executive Director of the Office of Juvenile Affairs, or
10 a designee;
- 11 8. The Commissioner of the Department of Mental Health and
12 Substance Abuse Services, or a designee;
- 13 9. The Commissioner of the State Department of Health, or a
14 designee;
- 15 10. The Executive Director of the Oklahoma Association of
16 Chiefs of Police, or a designee;
- 17 11. The Executive Director of the Oklahoma Sheriffs'
18 Association, or a designee;
- 19 12. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate, or a designee; and
- 20 13. The Speaker of the House of Representatives, or a designee.
- 21 B. The Advisory Task Force shall have the duty to study human
22 trafficking, prostitution and child exploitation in this state. The
23 Advisory Task Force shall make recommendations to the Legislature on
24 methods and laws to enhance and fund the efforts of law enforcement

1 or community groups that are working to slow and stop prostitution,
2 human trafficking or child exploitation; methods to assist in
3 identifying and interrupting websites that promote pornography and
4 sexually explicit materials; and methods that develop and support
5 community groups working with victims to interrupt cycles of abuse
6 or prevent human trafficking, prostitution, sexual abuse or other
7 factors influential in perpetuating human trafficking, prostitution
8 or child exploitation.

9 C. The Advisory Task Force shall have members appointed by
10 August 1, 2021. The Advisory Task Force shall begin meeting and
11 continue studying until January 1, 2022. A report of the findings
12 and recommendations shall be presented to the President Pro Tempore
13 of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the
14 Governor on or before February 1, 2022. Upon delivery of the
15 report, the Advisory Task Force shall terminate.

16 D. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum for the
17 purpose of conducting the business of the Advisory Task Force.

18 E. Members of the Legislature shall receive travel
19 reimbursements from their respective appointing authority in
20 accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

21 F. A Senate member shall call the initial meeting by September
22 1, 2021. The chair of the Advisory Task Force shall be appointed by
23 majority vote of the members.

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1 G. Staff of the Senate and House of Representatives shall
2 jointly assist in staffing the Advisory Task Force.

3 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2021.

4 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
5 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
6 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
7 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
