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SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 8-114 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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Except as provided in subsection B of this section, 4 5 beginning July 1, 2023, the transfer of a student from one school site to another school site within the school district where the 6 student resides shall be approved at any time in the year, unless 7 the grade level of the receiving school site has reached capacity. 8 9 If the capacity of a grade level is insufficient to enroll all 10 eligible students, the school district shall select intra-district transfer students based on the preferences outlined in paragraph 1 11 12 of subsection B of this section and then in the order in which the intra-district transfer applications were received. The capacity of 13 a school site shall be determined by the school district board of 14 education based on its policy adopted pursuant to subsection B of 15 this section. A student may be granted a one-year intra-district 16 transfer and may automatically continue to attend the school each 17 school year to which the student transferred with the approval of 18 the school district. At the end of each school year, a school 19 district may deny continued intra-district transfer of the student 20 for the reasons outlined in paragraphs 2 and 3 of subsection B of 21 this section. Any sibling of a student who transfers intra-district 22 may attend the school site to which the student transferred, if the 23 school district policy gives preference to sibling transfers 24

- regardless of capacity, and the sibling of the transferred student does not meet a basis for denial as outlined in paragraphs 2 and 3
- 3 of subsection B of this section. Any child in the custody of the
- 4 Department of Human Services in foster care who is living in the
- 5 home of a student who transfers intra-district, may attend the
- 6 school site to which the student transferred.
- 7 B. Each school district board of education shall adopt a policy
- 8 to determine the number of intra-district transfer students the
- 9 school district has the capacity to accept in each grade level for
- 10 each school site within a school district no later than July 1,
- 11 | 2023. The policy shall be publicly posted on the school district
- 12 | website. The policy:
- 1. Shall include an enrollment preference and reserve capacity
- 14 for:
- a. students who reside in the school site boundary,
- b. students who attended the school site the prior school
- 17 year, and
- 18 c. siblings of students who are already enrolled at the
- 19 school site;
- 20 2. May include the acts and reasons outlined in Section 24-
- 21 | 101.3 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes as a basis for denial of
- 22 | an intra-district transfer; and
- 3. May include a history of absences as a basis for denial of
- 24 an intra-district transfer. For the purposes of this section,

- "history of absences" means ten or more absences in one semester
 that are not excused for the reasons provided in subsection B of
 Section 10-105 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes or due to
 illness.
 - C. By the first day of January, April, July, and October of each year, the school district board of education shall establish the number of intra-district transfer students the school district has the capacity to accept in each grade level for each school site within the district.
 - D. After establishing the number of intra-district transfer students the school district has the capacity to accept in each grade level for each school site, the board of education shall:
 - 1. Publish in a prominent place on the school district website the number of intra-district transfer students for each grade level for each school site within the school district which the district has the capacity to accept; and
 - 2. Report to the State Department of Education the number of intra-district transfer students for each grade level for each school site within the school district which the district has the capacity to accept.
- 21 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.
- SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby

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declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
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    be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
