8 **An Act relating to professions and occupations;**
9 **prohibiting roofing contractor from waiving insurance**
10 **deductible as advertisement or inducement for sale;**
11 **requiring certain notice; providing penalty;**
12 **construing imposition of certain fine; providing for**
13 **codification; and providing an effective date.**

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1151.30 of Title 59, unless
17 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 A residential or commercial roofing contractor providing repairs
19 or improvement services to be paid by an insured from the proceeds
20 of a property or casualty insurance policy shall not, as an
21 inducement to the sale or provision of goods or services to an
22 insured, advertise or promise to pay, directly or indirectly, all or
23 part of any applicable insurance deductible or offer to compensate
24 an insured for providing any service to the insured. If a roofing
contractor violates the provisions of this section, the insurer to

1 | whom the insured tendered the claim shall not be obligated to
2 | consider the estimate prepared by the roofing contractor. Every
3 | roofing contractor shall provide a written notification of the
4 | requirements of this section with its initial estimate. The
5 | adjuster or insurer shall provide a written notification of the
6 | requirements of this section in the initial estimate relating to the
7 | claim.

8 | SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, **2022**.
