8	An Act relating to energy; creating the Oklahoma Oil and Natural Gas Regulatory Modernization Commission;
9	providing for Commission membership; outlining certain duties of the Commission; providing for
10	organizational meeting; allowing for certain outside parties to provide input; providing certain quorum
11	requirements; providing for Commission staffing; providing for cooperation of state entities;
12	requiring development and transmission of final report; prohibiting compensation related to
13	Commission service; providing for termination of Commission; providing for codification; and declaring
14	an emergency.
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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
18	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 318.11 of Title 52, unless there
20	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
21	A. There is hereby created the "Oklahoma Oil and Natural Gas
22	Regulatory Modernization Commission".
23	B. The Commission shall consist of eight (8) members as
24	follows:

1. The chairperson of the Energy and Natural Resources
Committee of the Oklahoma House of Representatives;

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- 2. The chairperson of the Energy Committee of the Oklahoma State Senate;
- 3. A member of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission appointed by a vote of the three members of the Corporation Commission, or a designee from the Oklahoma Corporation Commission;
- 4. The Attorney General, or a designee from the Office of the Attorney General;
 - 5. The Governor, or a designee from the Office of the Governor;
- 6. The Lieutenant Governor, or a designee from the Office of the Lieutenant Governor;
- 7. The chairperson of the Oklahoma Energy Resources Board, or a designee from the membership of the Oklahoma Energy Resources Board; and
- 8. The Secretary of Energy and Environment of the State of Oklahoma who shall serve as chairperson of the Commission and shall be a nonvoting member.
- 19 C. The Commission shall conduct an inquiry into the impact of
 20 new drilling activity on existing wells, both vertical and
 21 horizontal. The purpose of this inquiry is to determine and
 22 recommend possible changes, if needed, to current regulations. This
 23 shall include, but not be limited to:

1. Reviewing existing procedures for resolving disputes as they relate to well communication between two or more wells:

- 2. Identifying additional resource needs of the Oklahoma

 Corporation Commission for timely enforcement of administrative or judicial orders; and
- 3. Examining alternatives used by other states to resolve disputes as they relate to well communication between two or more wells and making recommendations for adoption of best practices.
- D. The Commission shall hold an organizational meeting no later than September 1, 2019. In furtherance of performing the duties ascribed in subsection C of this section, the Commission may seek input from stakeholders, including the various businesses regulated by the Corporation Commission.
- E. The Commission may conduct business without a quorum of its membership being present, but a quorum shall be required to be present for the purposes of adoption of the final report, as detailed in subsection H of this section, of the Commission.
- F. The Commission shall be staffed by the staff of the Office of the Secretary of Energy and Environment of the State of Oklahoma.
- G. The Commission may request the assistance of any state agency, board, commission, department or other entity of state government to acquire relevant information.
- H. The Commission shall develop a final report with specific recommendations and transmit the report not later than September 1,

2020, to the Governor, the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of
Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State
Senate.

I. Each member of the Commission shall serve without
compensation or reimbursement for travel related to Commission

compensation or reimbursement for travel related to Commission duties, aside from the compensation they might otherwise receive as authorized by law.

J. The Commission shall terminate effective the day following the transmission of the report required by subsection H of this section.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
