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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:								
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-2721, as								
17	last amended by Section 1, Chapter 286, O.S.L. 2018 (63 O.S. Supp.								
18	2020, Section 1-2721), is amended to read as follows:								
19	Section 1-2721. A. 1. The Physician Manpower Training								
20	Commission shall administer the Oklahoma Medical Loan Repayment								
21	Program.								
22	2. For the purposes of this section, "primary care physicians"								
23	shall mean physicians practicing in family medicine, geriatrics,								
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1 general internal medicine, general pediatrics,

2 obstetrics/gynecology, or emergency medicine, or general surgery.

3 3. For the purposes of this section, "health center" shall mean
4 a federally qualified health center as defined by 42 U.S.C., Section
5 1905(1)(2)(B).

4. For the purposes of this section, "Teaching Health Center"
shall mean a health center that supports the residencies of primary
care physicians within the operations of the health center.

9 5. The Program, depending upon and limited to available
10 funding, shall provide educational loan repayment assistance to
11 Oklahoma licensed primary care physicians and physician assistants
12 who agree to establish a practice in a community located in Oklahoma
13 approved by the Commission.

14 6. Each award shall be for a contracted period and shall be 15 distributed to the participant by drafts made payable to the 16 participant at the end of each contract year with disbursements not 17 to exceed an amount to be established annually by the Commission. 18 Prior to any disbursement, the Commission shall certify and properly 19 review reports submitted by the participating physician or physician 20 assistant detailing performance of activities in accordance with the 21 Program.

7. The Commission shall review the performance in the Program of the participating physician or physician assistant and determine

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whether an award may be granted for additional years pursuant to
 rules promulgated by the Commission.

B. The physicians and physician assistants entering the Program
each year shall agree to provide medical care and services in areas
designated by the Commission to provide medical care and services to
Medicaid recipients as authorized by the Oklahoma Health Care
Authority.

8 C. A physician or physician assistant shall be eligible to
9 participate in the loan repayment program Oklahoma Medical Loan
10 Repayment Program if the individual:

Is a physician that holds a current Oklahoma medical
 license;

13 2. Is a new primary care graduate physician or physician
14 assistant. Preference will be given to graduates of the primary
15 care residency programs affiliated with the Oklahoma State
16 University College of Osteopathic Medicine, the University of
17 Oklahoma College of Medicine and the teaching hospitals affiliated
18 with both schools of medicine and Teaching Health Centers located in
19 this state; or

3. Is a current practicing physician or physician assistant and
has met criteria established by the Commission.

D. The Commission may accept donations of public or private
 funds to assist in funding the <u>Oklahoma</u> Medical Loan Repayment
 Program. The Commission may, at its discretion, contract with other

public entities and non-profit nonprofit corporations for the endowment, management and administration of such funds.

E. The Commission shall present a report on the operation of the Program to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate within one (1) month of the beginning of each regular session of the Legislature, including but not limited to the progress made in accomplishing the goal of the Program.

9 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2011, Section 697.3, as
10 amended by Section 3, Chapter 67, O.S.L. 2020 (70 O.S. Supp. 2020,
11 Section 697.3), is amended to read as follows:

12 Section 697.3 The Physician Manpower Training Commission shall 13 be composed of seven (7) members appointed by the Governor with the 14 advice and consent of the Senate. Upon the expiration of the term 15 of one of the nonphysician members, three members shall be 16 practicing allopathic physicians, three shall be practicing 17 osteopathic physicians and one shall not be a physician nurse 18 practitioner. The membership shall be appointed from diverse 19 geographic areas of the state. No board member serving on November 20 1, 2001, shall be removed from the board to satisfy the requirements 21 of this section, but appointments to fill vacancies subsequent to 22 November 1, 2001, shall be subject to the requirements of this 23 section. Three members of the Commission shall be appointed for 24 one-year terms, two members shall be appointed for three-year terms

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1 and two members shall be appointed for five-year terms, and at the expiration of the initial terms, succeeding terms of office shall be 2 five (5) years in duration. There shall be also twelve additional 3 4 nonvoting ex officio members of the Commission who shall serve in an 5 advisory capacity only and include the Dean of the University of 6 Oklahoma College of Medicine or designee, the Dean of the University 7 of Oklahoma College of Medicine - Tulsa or designee, the Chair of the Department of Family Medicine of the University of Oklahoma 8 9 Health Sciences Center or designee, the Chair of the Department of 10 Family Practice of the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine -11 Tulsa or designee, the Chair of the Department of General Practice 12 of the Oklahoma College of Osteopathic Medicine and Surgery or 13 designee, the President of the Oklahoma Academy of Family Physicians 14 or designee, the President of the Oklahoma State Medical Association 15 or designee, the President of the Oklahoma State Osteopathic 16 Association or designee, the President of the Oklahoma Hospital 17 Association or designee, the State Commissioner of Health or 18 designee, the Provost of the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences 19 Center or designee, and the Dean of the Oklahoma College of 20 Osteopathic Medicine and Surgery or designee. Members of the 21 Commission shall serve without salary, but may be reimbursed for 22 travel expenses in attending meetings and performing their duties 23 pursuant to the State Travel Reimbursement Act, Section 500.1 et 24 seq. of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
