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7 An Act relating to professions and occupations;
8 making certain practitioners eligible for
9 reimbursement; requiring certain contract; providing
10 conditions for reimbursement; providing for
11 codification; and providing an effective date.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1362.2 of Title 59, unless there
15 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

16 A. Services provided by practitioners who have completed
17 education requirements to begin an internship or a postdoctoral
18 fellowship in an accredited clinical psychology academic training
19 program and are under current board-approved supervision toward
20 licensure are eligible for reimbursement.

21 B. For those licensure candidates who are actively and
22 regularly receiving board approved supervision, or extended
23 supervision by a fully licensed clinician if board's supervision
24 requirement is met but the individual is not yet licensed.

1 C. In order for services provided by clinical psychology
2 interns completing required internships, postdoctoral fellows
3 completing required supervision for licensure to be reimbursed, the
4 following conditions must be met:

5 1. The licensed practitioner must have a supervision agreement
6 letter from the Oklahoma State Board of Examiners of Psychologist on
7 file covering the dates of services of the internship or
8 postdoctoral fellowship;

9 2. The psychology intern or postdoctoral fellow must be under
10 the direct supervision of the licensed psychologist responsible for
11 the member's care;

12 3. The licensed psychologist responsible for the member's care
13 must:

- 14 a. staff the member's case with the intern or fellow,
- 15 b. actively direct the services,
- 16 c. be available to the intern or postdoctoral fellow for
17 consultation while he or she is providing services,
- 18 d. agree with the current plan for the member, and
- 19 e. confirm that the service provided by the intern or
20 fellow was appropriate; and

21 4. The member's medical record must show that the requirements
22 for reimbursement were met and the licensed psychologist responsible
23 for the member's care has reviewed, countersigned, and dated the
24 notes in the medical record at least every week so that it is

1 documented that the licensed psychologist is responsible for the
2 member's care.

3 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
