12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 173.1 of Title 47, unless there
15	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
16	A. There is hereby created, until July 1, 2024, the State Task
17	Force on Motor Carrier Regulation and Enforcement. The Task Force
18	shall be composed of the following seven (7) members:
19	1. The Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety or
20	designee;
21	2. One member of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission or
22	designee;
23	3. The Cabinet Secretary of Public Safety or designee;
24	4. The Cabinet Secretary of Transportation or designee;

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Some member selected by the Governor, who shall serve as the
 chair of the Task Force;

3 6. One member designated by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House
4 of Representatives who shall be a current member of the Oklahoma
5 House of Representatives; and

7. One member designated by the President Pro Tempore of the
7 Oklahoma Senate who shall be a current member of the Oklahoma
8 Senate.

9 B. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum for the
10 purpose of conducting the business of the Task Force. The Task
11 Force shall meet monthly and at such other times as may be called by
12 the chair.

C. Members of the Task Force shall receive no compensation for serving on the Task Force but shall receive travel reimbursement for necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties by their respective agencies in accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

18 D. The State Task Force on Motor Carrier Regulation and 19 Enforcement shall:

Study, evaluate, and make recommendations regarding the
 adequacy, scope, and effectiveness of regulatory, licensing, and
 permitting programs applicable to the motor carrier industry;

3 3. Study, evaluate, and make recommendations regarding the
4 adequacy, scope, and effect of civil and criminal enforcement
5 mechanisms of state laws governing the motor carrier industry;

4. Study, evaluate, and make recommendations regarding
combining within a state agency any motor carrier regulatory
programs or law enforcement functions; and

E. The Corporation Commission, the Department of Public Safety, and the Department of Transportation shall make all information and records available to the Task Force as the Task Force may require. These agencies shall also make their employees available to the Task Force for the Task Force to interview and gather information.

F. On or before December 1, 2023, the Task Force shall prepare 17 a report of its findings and recommendations to be submitted to the 18 Governor, the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives, the 19 President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma Senate, and the Chair of the 20 Public Safety and Transportation Committees in both the Oklahoma 21 House of Representatives and the Oklahoma Senate, and the minority 22 leaders of both the Oklahoma House of Representatives and the 23 Oklahoma Senate. 24

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1	G. Staffing for the Task Force shall be provided by the
2	Oklahoma House of Representatives.
3	SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
4	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
5	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
6	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
