11 **[agriculture - Revolving Fund - rules - guidelines -
12 grants - recipients - limitations - codification -
13 effective date]**

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 21-1 of Title 2, unless there is
17 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "International
19 Livestock Judging Competition, Shooting, and Precision Sports Grant
20 Act".

21 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
22 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 21-2 of Title 2, unless there is
23 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

24 A. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving
fund for the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry
to be designated the "International Livestock Judging Competition,

1 Shooting, and Precision Sports Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a
2 continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall
3 consist of all monies received by the State Board of Agriculture
4 from state-appropriated funds, federal funds, donations, grants, and
5 contributions from any public or private source and designated for
6 the purpose set forth in this section. All monies accruing to the
7 credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and
8 expended by the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and
9 Forestry for the purpose of administering the International
10 Livestock Judging Competition, Shooting, and Precision Sports Grant
11 Act. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued
12 by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law
13 with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
14 Services for approval and payment.

15 B. The International Livestock Judging Competition, Shooting,
16 and Precision Sports Revolving Fund shall never exceed Five Hundred
17 Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) at any given time.

18 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 21-3 of Title 2, unless there is
20 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

21 A. The Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry shall
22 administer the provisions of the International Livestock Judging
23 Competition, Shooting, and Precision Sports Grant Act.

1 B. The State Board of Agriculture shall promulgate rules and
2 adopt eligibility guidelines necessary to enforce and administer the
3 International Livestock Judging Competition, Shooting, and Precision
4 Sports Grant Act, including an application process for grants.
5 Teams that receive grants must be comprised of Oklahoma students who
6 are members of a National FFA Organization chapter or 4-H team that
7 has won a national competition and is eligible to compete in an
8 international livestock judging competition or members of a shooting
9 and precision sports team that is eligible to compete in a national
10 or international sports competition.

11 C. Grants shall be awarded to match the funds the teams have
12 raised in a one-to-one ratio (1:1), the total amount not to exceed
13 the estimated cost of the trip for an international livestock
14 judging competition.

15 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
