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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-103.9b of Title 70, unless
19	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
20	A. Beginning in the 2022-2023 school year, each local school
21	district shall conduct an annual fitness assessment, as approved by
22	the State Board of Education, each school year for students in
23	grades three through twelve, to be conducted in a course that
24	satisfies the physical education program required pursuant to

1 Section 11-103.9 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes or during the 2 school year where the assessment can be administered by trained 3 personnel, including, but not limited to, school nurses, physical 4 education and health teachers, coaches and any other certified 5 school employees. Such assessments shall include methods deemed by 6 the State Board of Education as appropriate to ascertain levels of 7 student physical fitness and include the factors and standards 8 required in subsection B of this section. A local school district 9 shall not be required to conduct the annual fitness assessment for 10 students with a disability or other condition that requires an 11 exemption as determined by the State Department of Education.

12 Β. The State Department of Education shall adopt an assessment 13 instrument that includes standards accessible to districts which 14 adequately express the most current and widely accepted best 15 practices and benchmarks in the areas of student health and physical 16 education to be used by all local school districts in assessing 17 student physical fitness. The minimum required contents of the 18 assessment shall address the measurements and assessment instrument 19 to be used by a school district in assessing student physical 20 fitness under this section. The assessment instrument shall:

21 1. Be based on factors related to student health, including 22 the following factors that have been identified as essential to 23 overall health and function:

24 a. aerobic capacity,

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- b. body composition, and

c. muscular strength, endurance and flexibility; and
J. Include criterion-referenced standards specific to a
student's age and gender and based on the physical fitness level
required for good health.

6 A school district shall annually provide the results of С. 7 individual student performance on the physical fitness assessment required by this section to the State Board of Education and the 8 9 Oklahoma State Department of Health. The results shall not contain 10 the name of the individual students, the student's Social Security number or the student's date of birth. The performance results 11 12 provided to the Board pursuant to this subsection may be used for 13 assessing the effectiveness of health programs and developing 14 recommendations for modifications to physical education and health 15 and wellness programs or related curriculum.

D. Not later than the last day of the school year, a school district shall provide a parent or guardian with a copy of the results of the physical fitness assessment of the parent's or guardian's child. The results provided to a parent or guardian under this subsection shall be clear, precise, and easy to understand.

E. 1. The State Department of Education and the Oklahoma State Department of Health shall analyze the performance results provided pursuant to subsection C of this section and identify, for each 1 school district, any correlation between the results and the 2 following:

3 a. student obesity,

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4 b. student attendance levels,

5 c. student academic achievement levels,

- d. student disciplinary problems, and
 - e. school meal programs.

8 2. The State Department of Education may contract with a public
9 or private entity for that entity to conduct all or part of the
10 analysis required in paragraph 1 of this subsection.

11 The State Board of Education's efforts may be supported with 12 state, federal or private funding or a combination thereof.

13 F. The State Board of Education shall submit an annual report 14 to the Governor, beginning October 1, 2023, and annually thereafter. 15 The report shall include the compliance status of each local school 16 The Governor may, in coordination with the State Board of district. 17 Education, establish one or more recognition programs to acknowledge 18 local school districts and schools which have most improved in their 19 physical fitness assessments. The Governor may collaborate with 20 private corporations in the development and implementation of 21 recognition programs pursuant to this subsection, including 22 providing monetary or other incentives to local school districts or 23 schools for attaining certain levels of health status. All local 24 school districts or schools receiving acknowledgment through a

1	recognition program established by the Governor pursuant to this
2	subsection shall also be recognized on the State Board of
3	Education's website.
