24 AMENDMENT NO. 1. Page 1, strike the title, enacting clause and
entire bill and insert

"An Act relating to higher education; allowing
certain nonprofit organizations to present sex

freshman students certain opportunities to attend sex
trafficking and exploitation prevention and education
programs; providing topics to be included in
programs; providing program materials to students,
parents and legal guardians at no cost; requiring
program provider to incur costs of implementing

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

5 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
6 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3250 of Title 70, unless there
7 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

8 A. Upon the effective date of this act, the Oklahoma State
9 Regents for Higher Education shall allow, if offered by nonprofit
10 organizations that specialize in outreach and education programs on
11 sex trafficking and exploitation, a series of in-depth prevention
12 and education programs regarding sex trafficking and exploitation to
13 all freshman students enrolled at institutions of higher education
14 within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education.

15 B. Institutions of higher education shall provide all freshman
16 students the opportunity to attend one of three on-campus, voluntary
17 sex trafficking and exploitation prevention and education programs
18 at any time including during freshman orientation activities, if
19 offered by nonprofit organizations that specialize in outreach and
20 education programs on sex trafficking and exploitation. The sex
21 trafficking and exploitation prevention and education programs shall
22 specifically provide students the following:

6 education programs and related program materials.

7 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

1 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 24-100.9 of Title 70, unless
3 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 A. The board of education of each school district in this state
5 may adopt a policy regarding sex trafficking and exploitation
6 prevention and awareness education programs for students.

7 B. The board of education of each school district in this state
8 may provide schoolwide education programs to all students in grades
9 seven through twelve and staff addressing sex trafficking and
10 exploitation prevention and awareness. The board of education of
11 each school district in this state may, if offered by nonprofit
12 organizations that specialize in outreach and education programs on
13 sex trafficking and exploitation, partner with such organizations
14 and make available to school districts such literature which
15 addresses sex trafficking and exploitation. Such literature and
16 services shall be at no cost to the school districts. Beginning
17 with the 2022-2023 school year, every school district may provide a
18 two-hour sex trafficking and exploitation prevention and awareness
19 training program for students in grades seven through twelve which
20 specifically includes the following:
