8 An Act relating to opioid antagonists; amending 63  
9 O.S. 2021, Section 1-2506.2, which relates to  
10 prescription of opioid antagonists to family members;  
11 replacing naloxone with opioid antagonist; amending  
12 63 O.S. 2021, Section 2-312.2, which relates to the  
13 sale or dispensation of naloxone; removing naloxone  
14 and replacing it with opioid antagonist; and  
15 providing an effective date.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-2506.2, is  
18 amended to read as follows:

19 Section 1-2506.2 A. Upon request, a provider may prescribe an  
20 ~~opiate~~ opioid antagonist to an individual for use by that individual  
21 when encountering a family member exhibiting signs of an ~~opiate~~  
22 opioid overdose.

23 B. When an ~~opiate~~ opioid antagonist is prescribed in accordance  
24 with subsection A of this section, the provider shall provide:

- 25 1. Information on how to spot symptoms of an overdose;
- 26 2. Instruction in basic resuscitation techniques;

1 3. Instruction on proper ~~naloxone~~ opioid antagonist  
2 administration; and

3 4. The importance of calling ~~911~~ nine-one-one (911) for help.

4 C. Any family member administering an ~~opiate~~ opioid antagonist  
5 in a manner consistent with addressing ~~opiate~~ opioid overdose shall  
6 be covered under the Good Samaritan Act.

7 D. Any provider prescribing or administering an ~~opiate~~ opioid  
8 antagonist in a manner consistent with addressing ~~opiate~~ opioid  
9 overdose shall be covered under the Good Samaritan Act.

10 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 2-312.2, is  
11 amended to read as follows:

12 Section 2-312.2 ~~Naloxone, also known as Narcan, or any of its~~  
13 ~~generic equivalents~~ Any opioid antagonist that is approved by the  
14 United States Food and Drug Administration may be dispensed or sold  
15 by a pharmacy without a prescription; provided, however, it shall be  
16 dispensed or sold only by, or under the supervision of, a licensed  
17 pharmacist. ~~Naloxone~~ An opioid antagonist may be prescribed and  
18 dispensed by a licensed pharmacist; provided, however, it shall be  
19 dispensed only by, or under the supervision of, a licensed  
20 pharmacist. No dispensing protocol shall be required.

21 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
