15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 1811.4C, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	Section 1811.4C A. The provisions of Title 47 of the Oklahoma
19	Statutes shall be applicable to all streets and highways within the
20	State Capitol Park in Oklahoma City and the State Capitol Complex in
21	Tulsa. The Department of Public Safety shall be the primary law
22	enforcement agency within the State Capitol Park and within the
23	State Capitol Complex, upon its establishment, and shall enforce and

 therein.

The rules for the "Use of the Public Areas of the Capitol 3 в. and Plazas" and for the "Use of the State Capitol Park", as 4 5 promulgated by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services and set out in Subchapters  $\frac{5}{5}$  3 and  $\frac{7}{5}$  of Chapter  $\frac{10}{60}$  60 of Title  $\frac{580}{260}$  260 6 of the Oklahoma Administrative Code, are applicable to the State 7 Capitol Park and State Capitol Complex. The Department of Public 8 9 Safety shall have the exclusive authority to enforce these rules. Α violation of a rule shall be a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, 10 shall be punishable by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding 11 12 one (1) year, or by a fine not exceeding Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment. 13

C. This section shall not be construed to divest the Cities of Oklahoma City or Tulsa of jurisdiction relating to the enforcement of any law or ordinance within said parks except the enforcement of laws regarding vehicle parking which shall be vested exclusively in the Department of Public Safety.

SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
