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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 143, O.S.L.
15	2014, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 189, O.S.L. 2015 (10A O.S.
16	Supp. 2015, Section 1-8-111), is amended to read as follows:
17	Section 1-8-111. A. The Department of Human Services shall
18	request consumer agencies to place a security freeze on the consumer
19	report or consumer record of every child in the custody of the
20	Department.
21	B. The Department of Human Services shall provide each youth in
22	its custody sixteen (16) years and older an annual credit report.
23	The Department shall inform the court with jurisdiction over the
24	youth of any inaccuracies in a credit report displaying evidence of

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identity theft or any other activity fraudulently made on behalf of the youth in custody. The Department may implement the requirements of this section subsection in stages beginning with youth in the independent living program whose credit rating may inhibit employment and housing opportunities when the child is no longer in custody.
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B. C. Within one (1) year of the effective date of this act

November 1, 2014, the Department of Human Services shall submit

annual reports on the implementation of the provisions of this act

to the Chair and Vice Chair of the Senate Health and Human Services

Committee and the Chair and Vice Chair of the House Human Services

Committee. Such reports shall include, but not be limited to, the

number of youths in the Department's custody receiving credit score

reports, the frequency of such reports, and administrative issues

faced by the Department in the implementation of this act. Such

reports shall continue to be issued by the Department until November

1, 2018.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2016.

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
