E. Benefits awarded under the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program shall be awarded to all eligible applicants without any limitation on the number of awards in any year other than the amount of funds available for the program and the number of eligible applicants. Subject to the provisions of subsection F of this section, if funds are not sufficient to provide awards for all

eligible applicants, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education
 shall make awards on the basis of need. Provided, the Oklahoma
 State Regents for Higher Education shall take into consideration
 other grants and scholarships received by an eligible applicant when
 making awards.

6 The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may, at the F. 7 time an award is made on behalf of an Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program student, set aside in the Oklahoma Higher Learning 8 9 Access Trust Fund funds for the full commitment made to such Higher 10 Learning Access Program student. 11 institution which is a member of The Oklahoma State 12 System of Higher Education, a postsecondary 13 vocational-technical career technology program that 14 meets the requirements to be eligible for federal 15 student financial aid offered pursuant to a duly 16 approved cooperative agreement between by a technology 17 center school and an institution of The Oklahoma State 18 System of Higher Education supervised by the State 19 Board of Career and Technology Education, or a private 20 institution of higher learning located within this 21 state and accredited pursuant to Section 4103 of this 22 title, and

f. executes an agreement pursuant to subsection C of Section 2605 of this title.

2. A student who is eligible to participate in the program
 pursuant to this subsection shall not be required to meet the
 eligibility requirements set forth in subsection A of this section.

4 C. To retain eligibility while pursuing the program of higher5 learning in which enrolled, the student shall:

6 1. Achieve a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on a 7 4.0 scale or its equivalent for courses taken through the student's sophomore year and achieve a minimum grade point average of 2.5 on a 8 9 4.0 scale or its equivalent for courses taken during the student's 10 junior year and thereafter. The provisions of this paragraph shall 11 not apply to any student who has received an Oklahoma Higher 12 Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the 2012-2013 school 13 year;

14 2. Maintain good academic standing and satisfactory academic 15 progress according to standards of the Oklahoma State Regents for 16 Higher Education;

Maintain satisfactory academic progress as required for
eligibility for federal Title IV student financial aid programs.
The provisions of this paragraph shall become effective for the
2012-2013 school year;

4. Comply with the standards related to maintenance of eligibility as promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education; and

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5. Refrain from conduct that leads to expulsion or suspension
 of more than one semester from an institution of higher education.
 A student who violates the provisions of this paragraph shall
 permanently lose eligibility for program benefits. The provisions
 of this paragraph shall become effective January 1, 2008.

D. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and the
State Board of Career and Technology Education shall promulgate
rules relating to maintenance of eligibility under the Oklahoma
Higher Learning Access Act by a student.

E. It is the intent of the Legislature that students in the ninth grade for the 1992-93 school year who are determined to be eligible Oklahoma Higher Learning Access students pursuant to the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Act shall be the first students eligible for benefits from the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust Fund.

16 F. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education are 17 authorized to study, develop and propose criteria for determining 18 award eligibility based upon the completion of seven (7) semesters 19 of high school coursework by a student.

20SECTION 8.AMENDATORY70 O.S. 2011, Section 2604, is21amended to read as follows:

Section 2604. A. Subject to the availability of funds, an amount equivalent to the nonguaranteed resident tuition for which an eligible Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program student is

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obligated at an institution of The Oklahoma State System of Higher
 Education shall be awarded by allocation from the Oklahoma Higher
 Learning Access Trust Fund.

4 Subject to the availability of funds, for each eligible Β. 5 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program student enrolled at a private institution of higher learning located within this state and 6 7 accredited pursuant to Section 4103 of this title, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall award from the Oklahoma 8 9 Higher Learning Access Trust Fund an amount equivalent to the amount 10 of resident tuition for which the student would be eligible if the 11 student were enrolled in a comparable program at a comparable 12 institution of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. 13 Comparability shall be determined by the State Regents.

14 С. Subject to the availability of funds, an amount equivalent 15 to the tuition for any eligible Oklahoma Higher Learning Access 16 Program student enrolled in a public postsecondary vocational-17 technical career technology program or course for the purpose set 18 forth in Section 2602 of this title that meets the requirements to 19 be eligible for federal student financial aid offered by a 20 technology center school supervised by the State Board of Career and 21 Technology Education shall be awarded by allocation from the 22 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust Fund. Provided, such 23 allocation shall not exceed the amount a student would have received 24

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for comparable enrollment at a two-year institution within The
 Oklahoma State System of Higher Education.

3 D. 1. An award allowed by this section shall not be allowed 4 for courses or other postsecondary units taken in excess of the 5 requirements for completion of a baccalaureate program or taken more than five (5) years after the student's first semester of 6 7 postsecondary enrollment. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may award the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program 8 9 benefits for courses of postsecondary units taken more than five (5) 10 years after the student's first semester of postsecondary enrollment 11 only in hardship circumstances; provided, however, no Oklahoma 12 Higher Learning Access Program participant may receive benefits 13 beyond a cumulative time period of five (5) years.

14 2. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may award 15 the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefits for a student's 16 first semester or other academic unit of postsecondary enrollment 17 taken more than three (3) years after the student graduates from 18 high school or completes an educational program equivalent to high 19 school graduation as authorized in subsection A of Section 2603 of 20 this title or after the student turns twenty-one (21) years of age 21 as authorized in subsection B of Section 2603 of this title if the 22 student is a member of the Armed Forces of the United States, the 23 Reserve Corps of the Armed Forces of the United States, or the 24 Oklahoma National Guard, and is ordered to active duty or active

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duty for special work or training and due to the duty commitment the student is unable to enroll prior to the end of the three-year period or before the student reaches twenty-one (21) years of age. The period shall be extended by the length of the term of duty.

3. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may
establish a maximum limit on the number of courses or other
postsecondary units to which Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program
benefits will apply.

9 4. An award for eligible Oklahoma Higher Learning Access
10 Program students enrolled in cooperative programs pursuant to
11 agreements between technology center schools and institutions of The
12 Oklahoma State System of Higher Education shall be satisfied for
13 both vocational-technical career technology and college work in
14 which enrolled pursuant to such cooperative program.

15 Ε. Benefits awarded under the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access 16 Program shall be awarded to all eligible applicants without any 17 limitation on the number of awards in any year other than the amount 18 of funds available for the program and the number of eligible 19 applicants. Subject to the provisions of subsection F of this 20 section, if funds are not sufficient to provide awards for all 21 eligible applicants, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education 22 shall make awards on the basis of need. Provided, the Oklahoma 23 State Regents for Higher Education shall take into consideration

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1 other grants and scholarships received by an eligible applicant when
2 making awards.

3 F. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education may, at the 4 time an award is made on behalf of an Oklahoma Higher Learning 5 Access Program student, set aside in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust Fund funds for the full commitment made to such Higher 6 7 Learning Access Program student. For all academic years, students who have previously received awards under the provisions of the 8 9 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Act, Section 2601 et seq. of this 10 title, and who have continued at all times to fulfill the 11 requirements for eligibility to receive awards provided pursuant to 12 this program shall be given an absolute priority for continued 13 financial support by the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program 14 superior to any students who are applying for such benefits for the 15 first time.

SECTION 9. This act shall become effective July 1, 2016. SECTION 10. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
