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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-131 of Title 70, unless there
18	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	Subject to the availability of funds, the State Department of
20	Education and the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education,
21	working in cooperation, shall:
22	1. Develop and implement programs to identify talented students
23	and recruit those students and other persons into the teaching
24	profession. Persons targeted for recruitment may include, but are

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not limited to, high school and undergraduate students, mid-career and retired professionals, honorably discharged and retired military personnel and members of underrepresented gender and ethnic groups;

- 2. Develop and distribute materials that emphasize the importance of the teaching profession and inform individuals about state-funded loan forgiveness and tuition assistance programs;
- 3. Give priority to developing and implementing recruitment programs to address the areas of teacher shortage identified in and the recommendations made in the educator supply-and-demand study as required by Section 6-211 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The Department may use discretionary funds to carry out the provisions of this paragraph;
- 4. Encourage cooperation between the business community and school districts to develop recruitment programs designed to attract and retain capable teachers, including programs to provide summer employment opportunities for teachers; and
- 5. Encourage major education associations to cooperate in developing a long-range program promoting teaching as a prestigious, respected and desirable career and to assist in identifying local activities and resources that may be used to promote the teaching profession.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2016.

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
