L 6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
L7	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 11 O.S. 2011, Section 36-113, as
L 8	last amended by Section 1, Chapter 375, O.S.L. 2019 (11 O.S. Supp.
L 9	2019, Section 36-113), is amended to read as follows:
20	Section 36-113. A. The Department of Transportation may, or
21	the board of county commissioners of any county or federally

23	body of a municipality having a population less than five thousand

(5,000) persons, construct, improve, repair or maintain any of the streets of the municipality.

- B. The board of county commissioners may construct, improve, repair, or maintain any of the streets of a municipality having a population of less than five thousand (5,000) persons subject to agreement between the governing bodies of the county and the municipality without regard to whether the municipality has passed a sales tax with proceeds earmarked to construct, improve, repair or maintain any of the streets or roadways of such municipality.
- C. The board of county commissioners may construct, improve, repair or maintain any of the streets of a municipality having a population of greater than five thousand (5,000) persons but less than fifteen thousand (15,000) persons if the municipality has passed a sales tax or fee with the proceeds earmarked to construct, improve, repair or maintain any of the streets or roadways of such municipality; provided, that the county has a population of less than one hundred fifty thousand (150,000) persons.
- D. Notwithstanding any provision of this section, the board of county commissioners may construct, improve, repair, or maintain any of the streets of a municipality if the county has a population in excess of one hundred fifty thousand (150,000) persons according to the most recent Federal Decennial Census. The agreements entered into pursuant to the provisions of this subsection may be performed without regard to whether the municipality has passed a sales tax

with proceeds earmarked to construct, improve, repair or maintain any of the streets or roadways of such municipality.

E. In counties containing municipalities with populations in excess of fifteen thousand (15,000) people, the board of county commissioners shall, by agreement with the municipality, certify extension of the county highway road system within the municipal boundaries. The roads shall be classified as suburban county roads and shall be a part of the total county road mileage of the county in which they are located. The municipality shall notify and consult with the board of county commissioners for any future improvements or expansion of suburban county roads.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 69 O.S. 2011, Section 316, is amended to read as follows:

Section 316. On the first day of February of every other year beginning in 2021, each county's board of county commissioners shall submit certified county road mileage to the State Transportation

Commission. The Commission, on or before the first day of June of each year, shall certify to the Oklahoma Tax Commission the county road mileage of each county and the total county road mileage of the state as such mileage existed on the first day of January of such year. Such mileage shall be the computation of the existing road mileage for counties including any mileage represented by streets or roads in municipalities with a population of less than two thousand five hundred (2,500) and any other streets and roads in
