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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 426, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	Section 426. A. The tax on retail medical marijuana sales will
17	be established at seven percent (7%) of the gross amount received by
18	the seller.
19	B. This tax will be collected at the point of sale. Except as
20	provided for in <del>subsection</del> subsections C and D, tax proceeds <del>will be</del>
21	applied primarily to finance the regulatory office shall be
22	appropriated in amounts as authorized by the Oklahoma Legislature.
23	C. Except as provided for in subsection D, if For the fiscal
24	year beginning July 1, 2022, and each subsequent fiscal year,

proceeds from the levy authorized by subsection A of this section exceed the budgeted amount for running the regulatory office, any surplus shall be apportioned with seventy-five percent (75%) going to the General Revenue Fund and may only be expended for common education including as follows:

6 1. Fifty-five percent (55%) of the total proceeds of the levy 7 to operating the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority, but in no event shall the total amount apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant 8 9 to this paragraph exceed Forty-two Million Dollars (\$42,000,000.00); 10 2. Thirty-three and three-quarters percent (33.75%) of the total proceeds of the levy to the State Public Common School 11 12 Building Equalization Fund for the purpose of funding redbud school 13 grants pursuant to Section 3-104 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma 14 Statutes. Twenty-five percent (25%) shall be apportioned, but in no 15 event shall the total amount apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant 16 to this paragraph exceed the amount of redbud school grant funds 17 awarded pursuant to subsection B of Section 3-104 of Title 70 of the 18 Oklahoma Statutes; and 19 3. Eleven and one-quarter percent (11.25%) of the total

20 proceeds of the levy to the Oklahoma State Department of Mental 21 Health and Substance Abuse Services and earmarked for drug and 22 alcohol rehabilitation, but in no event shall the total amount 23 apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this paragraph exceed 24 Seven Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$7,500,000.00).
