holidays, following the time of the most recently approved amendment to the measure, if any, and the consideration of the measure for final passage. For purposes of this section, the three-day period shall begin at the hour and minute, to be recorded in the journal of the chamber, as of which the measure is advanced from general order and placed before the chamber for its final reading whether a third reading or fourth reading and the expiration of the three-day period shall be computed as of the end of the third twenty-four hour period using the same hour and minute as determined to begin the three-day period.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
