7 8	An Act relating to court costs; creating the Criminal Court Costs Modernization Council; stating duties and purpose of the Council; directing state and local entities to provide records and information to the Council; stating membership of the Council; requiring organizational meeting to be held by certain date; providing for the selection of a chair and vice- chair; providing meeting requirements; stating what constitutes a quorum; making meetings subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act; providing for travel reimbursement; providing administrative support for the Council; directing the Council to submit report to certain state officials; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.									
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:									
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified									
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 163 of Title 28, unless there is									
19	created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:									
20	A. There is hereby created the Criminal Court Costs									
21	Modernization Council, hereinafter referred to as the "Council".									
22	The Council shall:									
23	1. Identify all criminal- and traffic-related, court-ordered									
24	fees, fines, costs, and assessments imposed under law;									

2. Identify the distribution of revenue derived from those
 debts and the expenditures made by those entities that benefit from
 the revenues;

3. Consult with state, county, and municipal entities that
would be affected by a simplification and consolidation of criminal
and traffic-related, court-ordered debts;

4. Evaluate and make recommendations to the Oklahoma
Legislature for consolidating and simplifying the imposition of
criminal- and traffic-related, court-ordered debts and the
distribution of the revenue derived from those debts with the goal
of improving the process for those entities that benefit from the
revenues;

5. Document recent annual revenues from the various penalty assessments and, to the extent feasible, evaluate the extent to which the amount of each penalty assessment impacts total annual revenues, imposition of criminal sentences, and the actual amounts assessed; and

Evaluate and make recommendations to the Oklahoma
Legislature to eliminate certain court-ordered costs and fees
assessed in criminal cases that are not related to the supervision
of defendants, court functions, criminal investigations, or data
collection expenses.

B. The recommendations of the Council shall be intended to
 modernize the collection of court costs in the State of Oklahoma.

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Each department, agency, board, or authority of the state or any unit of local government shall provide records and other information to the Council as requested by the Council to carry out its duties; provided, however, the Council and the provider of such information shall make appropriate arrangements to ensure that the provision of such information to the Council does not violate any applicable laws.

8 C. The Council shall be comprised of twelve (12) members to be 9 selected as follows:

10 1. The Administrative Director of the Courts, or designee;

11 2. A district attorney for a county or district with a 12 population of five hundred thousand (500,000) or more as determined 13 by the latest Federal Decennial Census, to be selected by the 14 District Attorneys Council, or designee;

3. A district attorney for a county or district with a
population of five hundred thousand (500,000) or less as determined
by the latest Federal Decennial Census, to be selected by the
District Attorneys Council, or designee;

4. A chief of police of a municipality with a population of
three hundred fifty thousand (350,000) or more as determined by the
latest Federal Decennial Census, to be selected by the Oklahoma
Association of Chiefs of Police, or designee;

23 5. A chief of police of a municipality with a population of
24 three hundred fifty thousand (350,000) or less as determined by the

latest Federal Decennial Census, to be selected by the Oklahoma
 Association of Chiefs of Police, or designee;

6. A sheriff of a county with a population of fifty thousand
(50,000) or more as determined by the latest Federal Decennial
Census, to be selected by the Oklahoma Sheriffs' Association, or
designee;

7 7. A sheriff of a county with a population of fifty thousand
8 (50,000) or less as determined by the latest Federal Decennial
9 Census, to be selected by the Oklahoma Sheriffs' Association, or
10 designee;

11 8. The Director of the State Department of Corrections, or 12 designee;

9. A public defender of a county with a population of three
hundred fifty thousand (350,000) or more as determined by the latest
Federal Decennial Census, to be selected by the Administrative
Director of the Courts, or designee;

17 10. The Executive Director of the Pardon and Parole Board, or 18 designee;

19 11. The President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate, or 20 designee; and

21 12. The Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives, or22 designee.

D. The Council shall hold an organizational meeting not later
than December 1, 2022, and shall select from its membership a chair

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and vice-chair. The Council shall elect any other officers during
 the first meeting and upon a vacancy in any office.

E. The chair shall call the first meeting and all subsequent meetings shall be made at the call of the chair. The Council may meet as often as may be required in order to perform the duties imposed upon it.

F. A quorum of the Council shall be required to approve any
final action and recommendation of the Council. For purposes of
this section, seven members of the Council shall constitute a
quorum.

G. The meetings of the Council shall be subject to the OklahomaOpen Meeting Act.

H. The members of the Council shall receive no compensation,
but travel reimbursement may be provided by their respective
organizations within the limits provided for state employees in the
Oklahoma State Travel Reimbursement Act.

17 I. Administrative support for the Council shall be provided by18 the Administrative Office of the Courts.

J. The Council shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations annually by December 31, 2023, and the same day each year thereafter to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate, and the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives.
