  - 4. The Executive Director of the Office of Educational Quality and Accountability or designee;
    - 5. A student with dyslexia, appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives;
  - 6. A parent of a student with dyslexia, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate;
    - 7. A classroom teacher, appointed by the Governor;
- 8. A special education teacher, appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives;
- 9. A school principal, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate;

  - 15. A member who is an Academic Language Therapy Association-certified Academic Language Therapist Qualified Instructor who is also a dyslexia therapist certified by the International Dyslexia Association, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate;
  - 16. A member who is part of a not-for-profit organization that encourages cooperation between educators, taxpayers and elected officials, appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives;
  - 17. A member of the Oklahoma House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives;
- 18. A member of the Oklahoma State Senate, appointed by the
  President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate;

1 19. A member who teaches reading instruction or special education instruction at a college of education within an institution of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate; and

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- A member who is a reading specialist or literary coach employed by a public school district that serves grades prekindergarten through twelfth, appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives; and
- 21. A member who is a speech-language pathologist, appointed by the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this act.
- C. Appointments to the task force shall be made by September 1, 2017. Members of the task force shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. A vacancy on the task force shall be filled by the appointing authority.
- D. The task force shall conduct an organizational meeting no later than October 1, 2017. The task force shall elect a chair and vice chair at the organizational meeting. A majority of the members present at a meeting shall constitute a quorum to conduct business.
- Ε. The task force shall be authorized to meet at such times as may be required in order to fulfill the duties imposed upon the task force by law. Members of the task force shall not be reimbursed for travel expenses.

- F. The task force shall:
- 1. Study how to effectively identify students who have reading difficulties, including dyslexia;
- 2. Study the response-to-intervention process (RTI), as well as other effective research-based approaches in reading and literacy, to identify the appropriate measures for assisting students with dyslexia;
- 3. Make recommendations for appropriate resources and interventions for students with reading difficulties, including dyslexia; and
- 4. Make this information available in a handbook for schools, teachers and families to use as a resource.
- G. The task force shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act and the Oklahoma Open Records Act.
- H. Staff assistance for the task force shall be provided by the Oklahoma House of Representatives and the Oklahoma State Senate.
- I. The task force shall issue a report of its findings to the Legislature and Governor no later than December 1, 2018 July 1, 2019.
- SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval."
