12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 68 O.S. 2021, Section 2947.2, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 2947.2 A. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022,
16	and for each fiscal year thereafter, ten percent (10%) of the
17	revenue collected pursuant to Section 3204 of this title shall be
18	apportioned by the Oklahoma Tax Commission monthly to the Oklahoma
19	Cooperative Extension Service for duties imposed on the Extension
20	Service pursuant to Sections 130.1 through 130.7 and Section 1500 of
21	Title 19 of the Oklahoma Statutes and Section 3006 of this title.
22	B. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022, and for each
23	fiscal year thereafter, eighty-eight and five-tenths percent (88.5%)
24	of the revenue collected pursuant to Section 3204 of this title

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1 shall be apportioned by the Oklahoma Tax Commission monthly to the 2 Oklahoma State University Center for Local Government Technology for duties imposed pursuant to Sections 2816 and 2862 of this title 3 related to any training, support, professional development, and 4 5 additional software necessary for county assessors, treasurers and boards of equalization, and the acquisition and administration of a 6 computer-assisted mass appraisal software system for county 7 governments; provided, the Oklahoma State University Center for 8 9 Local Government Technology may delay the acquisition of such software until such time as sufficient funds are available. 10

11 C. After the computer-assisted mass appraisal software 12 acquisition is complete and associated costs are paid, any Any county which elects not to participate in the Oklahoma State 13 University Center for Local Government Technology's computer-14 15 assisted mass appraisal software system may apply to make request to and upon such request, shall be refunded from the Center for Local 16 Government Technology for a refund up to ten percent (10%) of such 17 county's annual documentary stamp tax revenue apportionment received 18 by the Center for Local Government Technology; provided, if 19 available funds are insufficient for a ten-percent rebate, the 20 percentage shall be adjusted so that rebates may be paid or the 21 actual cost incurred by the requesting county of a computer-assisted 22 mass appraisal software system, whichever is less. The requesting 23 county shall also provide a receipt of payment from a computer-24

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assisted mass appraisal software vendor at the time of requesting a
<b>refund.</b> Funds refunded by the Center for Local Government
Technology to the requesting county shall be used by the county for
the purpose of acquisition, administration and support of a
computer-assisted mass appraisal software system.
SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.
SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
