14	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9-104.1 of Title 70, unless
16	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
17	A. A school district board of education may award contracts for
18	the sale of advertising on the exterior of transportation equipment,
19	including school buses, and auxiliary transportation equipment as
20	defined in Section 9-104 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
21	B. Each school district board of education which elects to
22	allow the placement of advertising on transportation equipment or
23	auxiliary transportation equipment as provided for in this section

1 1. Approve the content of all district-wide advertising 2 programs consistent with any restrictions established by the board; 2. Provide direction and oversight of the advertising process; 3 4 and 5 3. Annually review the effectiveness of the advertising programs and make necessary recommendations. 6 7 C. Any revenue raised from advertising placed on transportation equipment or auxiliary transportation equipment shall be deposited 8 9 in the general fund of the school district and used for school 10 district purposes as determined by the board of education. 11 D. In addition to any further restrictions which may be 12 established by each board of education, the content of 13 advertisements placed on transportation equipment or auxiliary 14 transportation equipment shall not: 15 1. Promote hostility, disorder or violence; 16 2. Attack or discriminate against any ethnic, racial or 17 religious groups; 18 Discriminate, demean, harass or ridicule any person or group 3. 19 of persons on the basis of sex; 20 4. Be libelous; 21 5. Inhibit the functioning of the school or school district; 22 Promote, favor or oppose the candidacy of any candidate for 6. 23 election or the adoption of any bond or budget issue or any public 24 question submitted at any election;

7. Be obscene or pornographic as defined by the local community
 2 standards or be of a sexual nature;

8. Promote gambling, the Oklahoma Education Lottery, the use of
drugs, alcohol, tobacco or firearms or the use of products or
services that create community concerns;

6 9. Promote any religious or political organization;

7 10. Interfere with existing school district advertisements or
8 marketing programs or any existing contracts; or

9 11. Use any district or school logo without prior approval.
10 E. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules establishing
11 requirements for the placement and size of advertisements on
12 transportation equipment or auxiliary transportation equipment.

F. Advertisements displayed on transportation equipment or auxiliary transportation equipment shall be painted on the surface of the equipment or be in the form of a sign or decal attached to the surface of the equipment and shall comply with the rules established by the State Board of Education pursuant to this section.

19 G. Any contract entered into by a school district board of 20 education for the placement of advertising on transportation 21 equipment or auxiliary transportation equipment as provided for in 22 this section shall require the advertiser to pay for the following 23 costs:

1. Placement of the advertisement on the equipment; and

1	2. Removal of the advertisement from the equipment after the
2	term of the contract has expired.
3	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
