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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1275 of Title 59, unless there
17	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
18	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
19	Community Health Worker Act".
20	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
21	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1276 of Title 59, unless there
22	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
23	As used in the Oklahoma Community Health Worker Act:
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1. "Certified community health worker" means a community health
 worker to whom the State Department of Health has issued a
 certificate to practice as a certified community health worker in
 this state;

5 2. "Community health worker" means a frontline public health 6 worker who is a trusted member and has a shared understanding of the 7 community being served.

- 8 a. This trusted relationship enables the community health
 9 worker to:
- 10 (1) serve as a liaison between health and social
 11 services and the community to facilitate access
 12 to services and improve the quality and cultural
 13 competence of service delivery,
- (2) assist in identifying and communicating gaps in
 current community and health care resources, and
- 16 (3) build individual and community capacity by
 17 increasing health knowledge and self-sufficiency
 18 through a range of activities such as outreach,
 19 community education, coaching, mentoring, social
 20 support, and advocacy.
- b. At a minimum, a community health worker shall be
 competent in the following:
- 23 (1) communication,
- 24 (2) interpersonal skills,

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1 (3) service coordination, 2 individual and community development, (4) 3 (5) individual and community advocacy, 4 (6) basic teaching skills, 5 (7) organizational skills, general knowledge of health care, and 6 (8) 7 cultural humility; and (9) 3. "Department" means the State Department of Health. 8 9 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 10 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1277 of Title 59, unless there 11 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 12 The State Department of Health in coordination with the Α. Oklahoma Public Health Association shall have the following powers 13 14 and duties with regard to establishing and maintaining certification 15 of community health worker training curriculum: 16 To evaluate and certify all community health worker 1. 17 education, training, competency programs and curriculum in 18 accordance with specifications and procedures approved by the 19 Department; 20 2. To prescribe, by rule, the scope of practice and the core 21 competencies of certified community health workers, including skills 22

and areas of knowledge that are essential to bring about expanded health and wellness in diverse communities and to reduce health disparities;

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3. To describe and define reasonable and necessary minimum
 qualifications, including education and training requirements, for
 certified community health workers;

4 4. To adopt standards and requirements for the approval or
5 acceptance of continuing education courses and competency programs
6 for the renewal of a certificate; and

7 5. To establish the criteria for granting, denying, suspending
8 and revoking a certificate in order to protect the health and safety
9 of the public.

10 B. The Department may promulgate rules:

That are necessary for the proper administration and
 enforcement of the Oklahoma Community Health Worker Act;

That allows for reciprocity agreements, including with the
 Indian Health Service, Tribal Health Systems and Urban Indian
 Clinics; and

16 3. That allow those currently serving in the capacity of a 17 community health worker to continue providing services without 18 certification.

C. The Department shall prescribe fees for certification of community health worker education, training and competency programs curriculum.

22 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1278 of Title 59, unless there 24 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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1	A. The State Department of Health shall promulgate rules to
2	offer voluntary certification for community health workers that
3	complete a competency program and receive education and training
4	through one of the certified curriculum programs.
5	B. The Department shall establish the criteria for granting,
6	denying, suspending and revoking a certificate in order to protect
7	the health and safety of the public.
8	C. The Department shall adopt rules that prescribe fees for the
9	voluntary certification of community health workers.
10	SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
