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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 3, Chapter 394, O.S.L.
17	2013, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 26, O.S.L. 2017 (70 O.S.
18	Supp. 2017, Section 18-114.14), is amended to read as follows:
19	Section 18-114.14 A. <u>1.</u> Beginning with the 2013-2014 <u>2018-</u>
20	2019 school year, teachers in the public schools of Oklahoma shall
21	receive in salary and/or fringe benefits not less than the amounts
22	specified in the following schedule following amounts based upon

11 <u>2. A school district shall have the sole authority to determine</u> 12 <u>any teacher salary and/or fringe benefits that exceeds the Minimum</u> 13 <u>Salary Schedule; provided, however, that the salary and/or fringe</u> 14 <u>benefits of a teacher employed as of the effective date of this act</u> 15 <u>shall never receive less than his or her present salary, provided</u> 16 that he or she is serving in the same job capacity.

17 в. 1. When determining the Minimum Salary Schedule, "fringe 18 benefits" shall mean all or part of retirement benefits, excluding 19 the contributions made pursuant to subsection A of Section 17-108.1 20 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes this title and the flexible 21 benefit allowance pursuant to Section 26-105 of this title from the 22 flexible benefit allowance funds disbursed by the State Board of 23 Education and the State Board of Career and Technology Education 24 pursuant to Section 26-104 of this title.

1 2. If a school district intends to provide retirement benefits 2 to a teacher such that the teacher's salary would be less than the amounts set forth in the minimum salary schedule specified in 3 4 subsection A of this section, the district shall be required to 5 provide written notification to the teacher prior to his or her employment, or if already employed by the district, no later than 6 7 thirty (30) days prior to the date the district elects to provide 8 retirement benefits such that the teacher's salary would be less 9 than the minimum salary schedule.

10 C. Any of the degrees referred to in this section shall be from 11 The Board a college recognized by the State Board of Education. 12 shall accept teaching experience from out-of-state school districts 13 that are accredited by the state board of education or appropriate 14 state accrediting agency for the districts. The Board shall accept 15 teaching experience from out-of-country schools that are accredited 16 or otherwise endorsed by the appropriate national or regional 17 accrediting or endorsement authority. Out-of-country certification 18 documentation in a language other than English shall be analyzed by 19 an educational credential evaluation service approved by the 20 National Association of Credential Evaluation Services (NACES). The 21 person seeking to have credit granted for out-of-country teaching 22 experience shall be responsible for all costs of the analysis by a 23 credential evaluation service. The Board shall accept teaching 24 experience from primary and secondary schools that are operated by

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the United States Department of Defense or are affiliated with the
United States Department of State.

3 D. For the purpose of state salary increments and retirement, 4 no teacher shall be granted credit for more than five (5) years of 5 active duty in the military service or out-of-state or out-ofcountry teaching experience as a certified teacher or its 6 7 equivalent. Nothing in this section shall prohibit boards of 8 education from crediting more years of experience on district salary 9 schedules than those allowed for state purposes. 10 E. The State Board of Education shall recognize, for purposes 11 of certification and salary increments, all the years of experience 12 of a: 13 1. Certified teacher who teaches in the educational program of 14 the Department of Corrections, beginning with fiscal year 1981; 2. Vocational rehabilitation counselor under the Department of 15 16 Human Services if the counselor was employed as a certified teacher 17 by the State Department of Education when the Division of Vocational 18 Rehabilitation was transferred from the State Board of Career and 19 Technology Education or the State Board of Education to the Oklahoma 20 Public Welfare Commission on July 1, 1968; 21 3. Vocational rehabilitation counselor which were completed 22 while employed by the Department of Human Services if such counselor 23 was certified as a teacher or was eligible for certification as a 24 teacher in Oklahoma;

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1	4. Certified teacher which were completed while employed by the
2	Department of Human Services Child Study Center at University
3	Hospital, if the teacher was certified as a teacher in Oklahoma; and
4	5. Certified school psychologist or psychometrist which were
5	completed while employed as a doctoral intern, psychological
6	assistant, or psychologist with any agency of the State of Oklahoma
7	if the experience primarily involved work with persons of school- or
8	preschool-age and if the person was, at the time the experience was
9	acquired, certified as, or eligible for certification as, a school
10	psychologist or psychometrist.
11	$rac{\mathbf{F}_{\mathbf{r}}}{\mathbf{F}_{\mathbf{r}}}$ The provisions of this section shall not apply to teachers
12	who have entered into postretirement employment with a public school
13	in Oklahoma and are still receiving a monthly retirement benefit.
14	E. In the event legislation is passed during the 2nd Session of
15	the 56th Legislature that increases teacher compensation, the
16	amounts described in subsection A of this section shall be increased
17	accordingly.
18	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2018.
19	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
20	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
21	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
22	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
