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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 85A O.S. 2021, Section 17, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 17. A. There is hereby created a Physician Advisory
16	Committee comprised of nine (9) members to be appointed as follows:
17	1. The Governor shall appoint three members, one of whom shall
18	be licensed in this state as a doctor of medicine and surgery, one
19	of whom shall be engaged in the practice of family medicine in a
20	rural community of the state, and one of whom shall be an
21	osteopathic physician;
22	2. The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint three
23	members, one of whom shall be licensed in this state as a doctor of
24	medicine and orthopedic surgery, one of whom shall be licensed in

1 this state either as a doctor of medicine or a doctor of osteopathy 2 and a neurosurgeon, and one of whom shall be licensed in this state 3 as a podiatric physician; and

3. The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint
three members, one of whom shall be licensed in this state as an
osteopathic physician, one of whom shall be licensed in this state
either as a doctor of medicine or a doctor of osteopathy and shall
be engaged in the practice of occupational medicine, and one of whom
shall be licensed in this state as a chiropractic physician.

Any member serving on the effective date of this section shall serve the remainder of his or her term. Thereafter, each position will be filled by the appointing official for a term of three (3) years. Members shall be subject to reappointment, with any new appointee to serve out the remainder of the unexpired term of the Committee member so replaced.

16 B. The Committee shall:

17 1. Assist and advise the Workers' Compensation Commission 18 regarding utilization review as it relates to the medical practice 19 and treatment of work-related injuries. Such utilization review 20 shall include a review of reasonable and necessary medical 21 treatment; abusive practices; needless treatments, testing, or 22 procedures; or a pattern of billing in excess of or in violation of 23 the Schedule of Medical Fees. The Physician Advisory Committee 24 shall review and make findings and recommendations to the Commission

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1 with respect to charges of inappropriate or unnecessary treatment or 2 procedures, abusive practices, or excessive billing disclosed 3 through utilization review;

Assist the Commission in reviewing medical practices of
health care providers, including evaluations of permanent disability
provided by health care providers. The Committee shall review and
make findings and recommendations to the Commission with respect to
charges of abusive practices by health care providers providing
medical services or evaluations of permanent partial disability
through the workers' compensation system;

3. After public hearing, review and make recommendations for acceptable deviations from the American Medical Association's "Guides to the Evaluation of Permanent Impairment";

4. After public hearing, adopt Physician Advisory Committee
Guidelines (PACG) and protocols for only medical treatment not
addressed by the latest edition of the Official Disability
Guidelines;

18 5. After public hearing, adopt Physician Advisory Committee
19 Guidelines for the prescription and dispensing of any controlled
20 substance included in Schedule II of the Uniform Controlled
21 Dangerous Substances Act if not addressed by the current edition of
22 the Official Disability Guidelines;

23 6. Review utilization on cases or of providers when requested
24 by any employer, injured employee or insurer. The Committee may

1 issue a public or private censure to any provider for utilization
2 which is excessive or inadequate, or recommend the Commission order
3 treatment within the treatment guidelines;

4 7. Provide general recommendations to the Commission on the5 issues of injury causation and apportionment;

6 8. Conduct educational seminars for the Commission, employers,
7 employees, and other interested parties;

8 9. Assist the Commission in accessing medical information from9 scientific literature; and

10 10. Report its progress annually to the Governor, the President 11 Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of 12 Representatives.

C. The Commission shall recognize the latest edition of the Official Disability Guidelines as the primary standard of reference, at the time of treatment, in determining the frequency and extent of services presumed to be medically necessary and appropriate for compensable injuries under this act, or in resolving such matters in the event a dispute arises.

D. Members of the Physician Advisory Committee shall receive no compensation for serving on the Committee but shall be reimbursed by the Commission for their necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

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E. Meetings of the Physician Advisory Committee shall be called by the Commission but held at least quarterly. The presence of a majority of the members shall constitute a quorum. No action shall be taken by the Physician Advisory Committee without the affirmative vote of at least a majority of the members.

F. The Commission shall provide office supplies and personnel
of the Commission to assist the Committee in the performance of its
duties.

9 G. Upon written request, the Insurance Commissioner, CompSource 10 Oklahoma, and every approved self-insured employer in Oklahoma shall 11 provide the Committee with data necessary to the performance of its 12 duties.

13 H. Any health care provider acting in good faith and within the 14 scope of the provider's duties as a member of the Physician Advisory 15 Committee shall be immune from civil liability for making any report 16 or other information available to the judges of the Commission or to 17 the Commission or for assisting in the origination, investigation, 18 or preparation of the report or other information so provided. 19 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024. 20 21 22 23 24
