An Act relating to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services; requiring that portions of certain appropriated funds be used for certain purposes; requiring that certain payment rates be increased by certain percentage; authorizing requests for early transfers of certain funds for specific purposes; providing for lapse of funds under certain conditions requiring certain budget procedures; prohibiting certain budget procedures; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. From the funds appropriated to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1600 of the 2nd Session of the 56th Oklahoma Legislature, a sum of not less than Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) shall be used in conjunction with funding described in Section 3 of this act towards restoring psychiatric inpatient, substance abuse residential, psychologist and agency-based therapy provider rates by three percent (3%).

SECTION 2. From the funds appropriated to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1600 of the 2nd Session of the 56th Oklahoma Legislature, the sum of Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000.00) shall be used for needs assessments.

SECTION 3. Any increase in federal funding related to an increase in the Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP) match rate shall be expended by the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services with priority given to addressing the agency's maintenance needs first, which shall mean maintaining current levels of services, addressing provider rates as described in Section 1 of this act and addressing caps in therapy and case management services imposed during the preceding twenty-four-month period.

SECTION 4. The Commissioner of the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services may request through the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services the early transfer by the Oklahoma Tax Commission of tax collections to the General Revenue Fund for the purpose of early allocation to the Department's disbursing funds to alleviate cash-flow problems.

SECTION 5. Appropriations made by Enrolled Senate Bill No. 1600 of the 2nd Session of the 56th Oklahoma Legislature, not including appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019 (hereafter FY-19), or may be

1 budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020 (hereafter FY-20). 2 Funds budgeted for FY-19 may be encumbered only through June 30, 2019, and must be expended by November 15, 2019. Any funds 3 4 remaining after November 15, 2019, and not budgeted for FY-20, shall 5 lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then-current fiscal year. Funds budgeted for FY-20 may be encumbered only through June 6 7 30, 2020. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2020, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then-current fiscal year. 8 These appropriations shall not be budgeted in both fiscal years 10 simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-19, and not required to pay 11 obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted for FY-20, after 12 the agency to which the funds have been appropriated has prepared 13 and submitted a budget work program revision removing these funds 14 from the FY-19 budget work program and after such revision has been 15 approved by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services. 16 SECTION 6. This act shall become effective July 1, 2018. 17 SECTION 7. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 18 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby 19 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and 20 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
