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7	<u>AS INTRODUCED</u>
8	An Act relating to childbirth and mental health; amending 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-740.16, which
9	relates to definitions used in the Choosing Childbirth Act; modifying definition; amending 63
10	0.S. 2021, Section 1-740.17, which relates to grants to private organizations for services; modifying
11	grantmaking authority of the State Department of Health; describing methods of making grants and
12	approving grant amounts; stipulating additional reimbursable services; extending time period of
13	certain services; including the State Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services; amending
14	63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-740.18, which relates to grant compliance and monitoring; conforming language;
15	providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
20	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-740.16, is
21	amended to read as follows:
22	Section 1-740.16 As used in the Choosing Childbirth Act:
23	1. "Abortion" means the use or prescription of any instrument,
24	medicine, drug or any other substance or device to intentionally:

1	a. kill the unborn child of a woman known to be pregnant,
2	or
3	b. terminate the pregnancy of a woman known to be
4	pregnant, with an intention other than:
5	(1) after viability of the unborn child, to produce a
6	live birth and preserve the life and health of
7	the child born alive, or
8	(2) to remove a dead unborn child;
9	2. "Unborn child" means an individual organism of the species
10	Homo sapiens from fertilization until birth; and
11	3. "Grant-supervising entity" means a private entity which
12	approves all grants made under the Choosing Childbirth Act that are
13	not directly made to private organizations by the State Department
14	of Health for reimbursement of services provided under the Choosing
15	Childbirth Act and which:
16	a. is organized as a not-for-profit corporation in
17	<del>Oklahoma</del> this state and as a 501(c)3 entity under the
18	federal Internal Revenue Code, and
19	b. does not encourage or counsel any woman to have an
20	abortion not necessary to prevent her death, to
21	provide her such an abortion or to refer her for such
22	an abortion, and does not accept funds or services
23	knowingly from any entity which performs abortions or
24	receives money for abortions.

1SECTION 2.AMENDATORY63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-740.17, is2amended to read as follows:

Section 1-740.17 A. The State Department of Health and the
Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services
shall make grants, as directed in subsection B of this section, from
funds appropriated by the Legislature specifically for this purpose,
to a grant-supervising entity for the purpose of reimbursing for the
Choosing Childbirth Act.

<u>B. The purpose of the grants shall be to reimburse</u> private
organizations in <del>Oklahoma</del> <u>this state</u> for the reasonable expenses of
programs providing the <del>following</del> services <u>listed in subsection C of</u>
<u>this section</u>. The Departments shall make grants either:

13 <u>1. Directly to the private organizations;</u>

14 <u>2. To one or more grant-supervising entities</u>, who shall 15 <u>reimburse the private organizations</u>; or

16 <u>3. Both directly to the private organizations and to one or</u> 17 <u>more grant-supervising entities, who shall reimburse the private</u> 18 organizations.

19 <u>C. Reimbursable services provided under the Choosing Childbirth</u> 20 <u>Act shall include:</u>

Providing information on, referral to and assistance in
 securing the services of relevant existing programs or agencies that
 assist women in Oklahoma this state to carry their children to term,
 and/or providing services that assist women to carry their children

1 to term including, but not limited to, agencies and programs that
2 will provide:

3	<u>a.</u> medical attention for the pregnant woman for the
4	duration of her pregnancy including, but not limited
5	to, obstetric ultrasounds,
6	b. mental health and substance abuse services,
7	<u>c.</u> nutritional support services,
8	<u>d.</u> housing assistance,
9	e. transportation assistance,
10	<u>f.</u> adoption services,
11	g. education and employment assistance, and
12	<u>h.</u> parenting education and support services;
13	2. Providing women in <del>Oklahoma</del> this state, in person and
14	through community outreach, information and/or services that
15	encourage and assist them to carry their children to term; and
16	3. Providing services including, but not limited to, healthcare
17	services to mothers and infants up to three (3) years postpartum for
18	the purpose of reducing the rates of maternal mortality and infant
19	mortality in this state by three percent (3%) within five (5) years
20	of the effective date of this act not later than July 1, 2026;
21	provided, however, no funds shall be provided to an organization
22	that provides, or whose affiliates provide, abortion services.
23	B. D. To be eligible for a service grant, an organization
24	shall:

1	1. Be registered with the <del>Oklahoma</del> Secretary of State as a not-
2	for-profit corporation located in Oklahoma or be a certified
3	treatment provider by the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and
4	Substance Abuse Services.+
5	2. Have the grant amount approved by $\frac{a:}{a}$
6	a. the grant-supervising entity, if the grant was
7	provided to the private organization by a grant-
8	supervising entity, or
9	b. if the grant was provided directly, by the State
10	Department of Health or the Oklahoma Department of
11	Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services;
12	3. For services described in paragraphs 1 and 2 of subsection $A$
13	$\underline{C}$ of this section, provide each pregnant woman counseled with
14	accurate information on the developmental characteristics of unborn
15	children including offering the printed information described in
16	Section 1-738.3 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes;
17	4. Assure that the grant's sole purposes are to assist and
18	encourage women to carry their children to term and to maximize
19	their potentials thereafter as provided in paragraphs 1 and 2 of
20	subsection C of this section or to reduce the rates of maternal
21	mortality and infant mortality in this state as provided in
22	paragraph 3 of subsection $A \subseteq C$ of this section; and
23	5. Assure that none of the funds provided pursuant to the
24	Choosing Childbirth Act, nor any other funds or services provided by

1 the organization, are used to encourage or counsel a woman to have 2 an abortion not necessary to prevent her death, to provide her such 3 an abortion or to refer her for such an abortion.

4 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-740.18, is 5 amended to read as follows:

6 Section 1-740.18 The State Department of Health shall make 7 grants to a grant-supervising entity under the Choosing Childbirth Act from funds appropriated by the Legislature specifically for this 8 9 purpose. The State Department of Health shall annually monitor and 10 review the any grant-supervising entity participating in the 11 Choosing Childbirth act and any private organization directly 12 receiving a service grant from the Department to assure ensure that 13 the grant-supervising entity or private organization carefully 14 adheres to the purposes and requirements of the Choosing Childbirth 15 Act, and it. The Department shall cease funding a grant-supervising 16 entity or private organization that fails to do so adhere to such

17 <u>purposes and requirements</u> if the Department proves specific findings 18 of noncompliance, subject to judicial review.

19 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.

20 SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 21 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby 22 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and

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1	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
