HOUSE BILL 4119

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1364, which relates to discharging a firearm; making certain acts unlawful; providing penalties; providing for the revocation of handgun license; making certain acts unlawful; providing penalties; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1364, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1364.

DISCHARGING FIREARM

A. Every person who willfully discharges any pistol, rifle, shotgun, airgun or other weapon, or throws any other missile in any public place, or in any place where there is any person to be endangered thereby, although no injury to any person shall ensue, is guilty of a misdemeanor.

B. Every person who willfully discharges any pistol, rifle, shotgun, airgun or other weapon, or throws any other missile, bomb,

1 or explosive device in any public place, or in any place where there
2 is any person to be endangered thereby, which results in the death
3 of any person is, upon conviction, guilty of a felony punishable by
4 death, by imprisonment for life without parole, or by imprisonment
5 for life in the custody of the Department of Corrections.

6 C. Any person convicted of a violation of the provisions of
7 this section after having been issued a handgun license pursuant to
8 the provisions of the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act shall have the
9 license ~~suspended for a period of six (6) months and shall be~~
10 ~~subject to an administrative fine of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00),~~ revoked
11 upon a hearing and determination by the Oklahoma State Bureau of
12 Investigation that the person is in violation of the provisions of
13 this section.

14 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-903.1 of Title 47, unless
16 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 Any person who drives a motor vehicle into a large crowd of
18 persons without regard for the safety of said persons and with the
19 intent to do physical harm shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a
20 felony punishable by death, by imprisonment for life without parole,
21 or by imprisonment for life in the custody of the Department of
22 Corrections.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
