13	WHEREAS, pornography is creating a public health crisis and
14	therefore its harms are beyond the capability of the individual to
15	address alone;
16	WHEREAS, efforts to prevent pornography exposure and addiction,
17	to educate individuals and families concerning its harms, and to
18	develop recovery programs must be addressed systemically in ways
19	that hold broader influences accountable in order to counter the
20	sexually toxic environment pornography perpetuates;
21	WHEREAS, pornography is contributing to the hyper-sexualization
22	of teens and even prepubescent children in our society;
23	WHEREAS, due to the advances in technology and the universal
24	availability of the Internet, young children are exposed to what

used to be referred to as hard core pornography, now considered mainstream pornography, at an alarming rate;

WHEREAS, twenty-seven percent (27%) of older millennials, twenty-five (25) to thirty (30) years of age, are reporting that they first viewed pornography before puberty;

WHEREAS, early exposure is leading to low self-esteem and eating disorders, an increase in problematic sexual activity at younger ages and an increased desire to engage in risky sexual behavior as young adolescents;

WHEREAS, children and youth are exposed to pornography which oftentimes serves as their sex education and shapes their sexual templates;

WHEREAS, because pornography treats women as objects and commodities for the viewer's use, it teaches girls they are to be used and teaches boys to be users;

WHEREAS, pornography normalizes violence and abuse of women and children:

WHEREAS, pornography treats women and children as objects and often depicts rape and abuse as if such acts are harmless;

WHEREAS, pornography equates violence toward women and children with sex and pain with pleasure, which increases the demand for sex trafficking, prostitution, child sexual abuse images or child pornography;

WHEREAS, pornography has potential detrimental effects on users such as emotional, mental and medical illnesses, shaping deviant sexual arousal, difficulty forming or maintaining intimate relationships, brain development and functioning and problematic or harmful sexual behaviors and addiction;

WHEREAS, recent research indicates that pornography is biologically addictive, which means the user requires more novelty, which is often in the form of more shocking material, in order to be satisfied. This has led to increasing themes of risky sexual behaviors, extreme degradation, violence and child sexual abuse images or child pornography;

WHEREAS, pornography use has a detrimental effect on the family unit as it is linked to lessening the desire of young men to marry, dissatisfaction in marriage and infidelity.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 56TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE

CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Legislature of the State of Oklahoma recognizes the public health crisis created by pornography.

THAT the Legislature recognizes the need for education, prevention, research and policy change at the community and societal level in order to address the epidemic that is harming the people of our state and our country as a whole.
