8	A Concurrent Resolution directing the Oklahoma Health Care Authority to refrain from awarding certain
9	contract; and directing distribution.
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12	WHEREAS, Oklahoma and our nation are facing universal Medicaid
13	uncertainty unparalled since Medicaid's inception in 1965; and
14	WHEREAS, federal funding for the state's Medicaid program may be
15	in jeopardy over the near future without careful coordination
16	between the state and the federal government, health care and mental
17	health provider community; and
18	WHEREAS, state tax revenues make up 18 percent of the total
19	state Medicaid budget; and
20	WHEREAS, Oklahoma's Medicaid budget has been cut by over \$400
21	million since 2010 resulting in lower health care and mental health-
22	provider rates and reducing access to care for the Medicaid
23	population; and
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1 WHEREAS, Oklahoma's hospitals, nursing homes and behavioral 2 health providers partner with the Oklahoma Health Care Authority by providing the state match for much of their provider rates resulting 3 4 in very successful public/private partnerships; and 5 WHEREAS, funding and sustainability for Oklahoma's Children's Hospital is impacted by loss of state and federal dollars; and 6 7 WHEREAS, Oklahoma's only Level One Trauma Center that provides 8 24-hour trauma care to Oklahoma's citizens would be tragically 9 impacted by the loss of state and federal dollars; and 10 WHEREAS, Oklahoma's two medical schools depend on Medicaid dollars for medical education and rural outreach and may be 11 12 seriously impacted by the loss of federal dollars; and 13 WHEREAS, the OU Health Sciences Center (OUHSC) and OSU Center 14 for Health Sciences (OSUCHS) are economic engines to the Oklahoma 15 City and Tulsa communities and their campuses collectively serve all 16 77 counties through medical outreach, medical residencies and 17 complex specialty care; and 18 WHEREAS, the OSUCHS strives to enhance rural and underserved 19 health care through an aggressive physician recruitment program, 20 valuable physician training programs and the utilization of OSU 21 outreach and access programs, and the loss of funds would be 22 detrimental to these programs and an already fragile state health

23 system; and

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WHEREAS, "supplemental payments" and "provider fees" generate
 approximately \$650 million federal dollars annually to the state
 Medicaid program and those dollars may be at risk.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 56TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE
CONCURRING THEREIN:

7 THAT the Oklahoma Health Care Authority is hereby directed to 8 refrain from awarding or signing any contract based on the request 9 for proposals initiated for care coordination models for aged, blind 10 and disabled persons, due to the uncertainty of new federal managed 11 care regulations that will impact the Medicaid budget, until further 12 review and approval pursuant to legislation enacted by the 13 Legislature in the 2nd Session of the 56th Oklahoma Legislature.

14 THAT a copy of this resolution shall be dispatched to the 15 Administrator of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority and members of 16 the Oklahoma Health Care Authority Board.
