1 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES - FLOOR VERSION 2 STATE OF OKLAHOMA 1st Session of the 59th Legislature (2023) 3 4 HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 1009 By: McEntire of the House 5 and 6 Haste of the Senate 7 8 9 10 AS INTRODUCED A Concurrent Resolution designating Hypertrophic 11 Cardiomyopathy Awareness Day and supporting efforts 12 to educate people about hypertrophic cardiomyopathy. 1.3 14 15 16 WHEREAS, Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy (HCM) is a chronic 17 cardiovascular disease involving thickening of the heart muscle and 18 can potentially lead to debilitating symptoms and serious 19 complications including heart failure, atrial fibrillation, stroke, 20 and in rare cases sudden cardiac death; and 2.1 WHEREAS, HCM is the most common inheritable heart disease and 22 can affect anyone regardless of age, gender, or ethnicity with a 23 reported prevalence ranging from 1 in 200 to 1 in 500 in the general 24 population; and

1	WHEREAS, an estimated 700,000 people in the United States have
2	HCM, yet 85 percent of them may remain undiagnosed; and
3	WHEREAS, HCM shares symptoms with other common cardiovascular
4	and pulmonary diseases, such as shortness of breath, chest pain,
5	fatigue, palpitations, and fainting, making it difficult to
6	distinguish HCM from these other diseases; and
7	WHEREAS, all-cause mortality risk is three to four times higher
8	in patients with HCM than that of the general population; and
9	WHEREAS, knowing one's medical history and any signs and
10	symptoms of HCM is an important first step in receiving an accurate
11	diagnosis of HCM; and
12	WHEREAS, a health care provider must conduct a thorough
13	screening with cardiac health questions to help identify a risk of
14	cardiac disorders, both genetic and congenital; and
15	WHEREAS, a health care provider may conduct several tests,
16	including an echocardiogram, a cardiac MRI, or genetic testing to
17	confirm a family history of HCM, and must examine the heart to
18	diagnose HCM; and
19	WHEREAS, following a diagnosis of HCM, it is important for

for patients to work with their health care provider to learn more about their disease and understand different management options, including prescription medicines and surgical treatment options that may help; and

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1 WHEREAS, the Legislature designates the fourth Wednesday in 2 February as Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy Awareness Day.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma Legislature supports the designation of the fourth Wednesday in February of each year as "Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy Awareness Day" in the State of Oklahoma in order to raise public awareness about hypertrophic cardiomyopathy; acknowledges the critical importance of hypertrophic cardiomyopathy awareness to improve cardiovascular health in the State of Oklahoma; supports raising awareness of the consequences of undiagnosed and untreated hypertrophic cardiomyopathy and the need to seek appropriate care for hypertrophic cardiomyopathy as a serious public health issue; and respectfully requests the Governor to issue annually a proclamation recognizing the fourth Wednesday in February in the State of Oklahoma as "Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy Awareness Day" and calls upon the people in the State of Oklahoma to observe the day with appropriate programs and activities.
