9	A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or
10	rejection a proposed amendment to the Constitution of
11	the State of Oklahoma by adding a new Section 33A to Article V; requiring supermajority approval for
12	certain state questions; providing for determination of increases in state expenditures; prescribing
13	wording for ballot title; providing procedures related to legislative referred measures; providing
14	ballot title; and directing filing.
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16	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE OF THE
17	1ST SESSION OF THE 58TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
18	SECTION 1. The Secretary of State shall refer to the people for
19	their approval or rejection, as and in the manner provided by law,
20	the following proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of
21	Oklahoma by adding a new Section 33A to Article V thereof, to read
22	as follows:
23	A. If any state question, whether in the form of an amendment
24	to the Oklahoma Constitution or amendments, new law enactments or

repeals, in any combination thereof, with respect to the Oklahoma Statutes, submitted to a popular vote either by initiative petition or in the form of a measure referred by the Legislature, would require an increase in the expenditures of any branch or department of state government, such question shall require the approval of sixty percent (60%) of those voting on the question or such question shall not become effective or binding as law.

Prior to the time that an initiative petition is filed with 8 В. 9 the Secretary of State, the proponents of the proposal shall obtain 10 a certification from the State Auditor and Inspector or an entity, 11 including any successor entity, designated for such purpose by the 12 Legislature by statute enacted after the approval of this question, 13 whether the proposal will or will not increase state expenditures as 14 described in subsection A of this section. If the certification 15 concludes that there would be an increase in expenditures, the 16 ballot title for the initiative petition shall contain the following 17 statement at the beginning of the ballot title and shall precede any 18 other wording: "The approval of this proposal has been determined 19 by the State of Oklahoma to require an increase in state government 20 expenditures and requires sixty percent (60%) approval in order to 21 become adopted as law." The wording for the ballot title as 22 prescribed by this section may not be modified by the Attorney 23 General.

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1 C. If any measure referred to a vote of the people by the 2 Legislature, whether in the form of statutes or amendments to the Oklahoma Constitution, is determined to require an increase in state 3 4 expenditures, the ballot title for the measure shall comply with the 5 requirements of subsection A and B of this section, and the chamber from which such measure originates shall obtain the certification 6 7 from either the State Auditor and Inspector or the entity designated by law to provide the certification. The certification shall be 8 9 obtained prior to the final passage of the measure and shall be 10 obtained so that if the certification determines that an increase in state expenditures would be required if the measure is approved, the 11 12 ballot title for the measure shall conform to the requirements of 13 subsection B of this section. The wording for the ballot title as 14 prescribed by this section may not be modified by the Attorney 15 General.

16 SECTION 2. The Ballot Title for the proposed Constitutional 17 amendment as set forth in SECTION 1 of this resolution shall be in 18 the following form:

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 THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:

This measure amends the Oklahoma Constitution. It would add a new Section 33A to Article V. This amendment to the Oklahoma Constitution would apply to initiative petitions and to measures

1 referred to the statewide ballot by the Legislature. The 2 measure would require a supermajority approval of certain types 3 of state questions. It would apply to amendments to the 4 Oklahoma Constitution. It would apply to amendments, new 5 enactments or repeals, in any combination, to the Oklahoma Statutes. It would require sixty-percent (60%) approval if the 6 7 state question would cause an increase in expenditures by any branch of state government, including the legislative branch, 8 9 the executive branch or the judicial branch. If the State 10 Auditor or Inspector or other state entity found that the 11 proposal would require an increase in state expenditures, a certification of that fact would be issued. If a measure is 12 13 certified to require an increase in expenditures, it will have a 14 sentence in the ballot title. The sentence will read as 15 "The approval of this proposal has been determined by follows: 16 the State of Oklahoma to require an increase in state government 17 expenditures and requires sixty percent (60%) approval in order 18 to become adopted as law." 19 SHALL THE PROPOSAL BE APPROVED? 20 FOR THE PROPOSAL - YES 21 AGAINST THE PROPOSAL - NO

SECTION 3. The Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives, immediately after the passage of this resolution, shall prepare and file one copy thereof, including the Ballot Title set forth in
