7	An Act relating to education funds; creating the Oklahoma Education Improvement Revolving Fund;			
8	stating source of funds; stating purpose of funds; requiring expenditures to be made upon warrants;			
9	requiring the apportionment of certain monies to the fund; requiring apportionments to be divided in a			
10	certain manner; prohibiting the supplanting or replacement of existing state funds; directing the			
11	State Board of Equalization to examine and investigate expenditures and issue findings and a			
12	report; providing for supplanted amount to be specified by the Board; requiring the Legislature to			
13	replenish the state funding under certain circumstances; providing for a reduction in			
14	apportionments under certain circumstances; stating use of monies in the fund; providing for			
15	codification; and providing conditional effective date.			
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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:			
19	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified			
20	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 18-114.15 of Title 70, unless			
21	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:			
22	There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund			
23	for the State Board of Education to be designated the "Oklahoma			
24	Education Improvement Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a			

1 continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall 2 consist of all monies received by the State Board of Education from 3 funds accruing in the Oklahoma Education Improvement Fund created by Senate Joint Resolution No. of the 2nd Session of the 56th 4 5 Oklahoma Legislature. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund 6 are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the 7 State Board of Education for the purpose of providing a salary increase for certified teachers, as defined by Section 1-116 of 8 9 Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Expenditures from the fund shall 10 be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims 11 filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of 12 Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment. SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 18-114.16 of Title 70, unless 14 15 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: A. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, and for each 16 fiscal year thereafter, the State Board of Education shall apportion 17 to the various school districts the proceeds from the Oklahoma 18 Education Improvement Revolving Fund on the basis of teacher 19 population, as collected by the State Board of Education for the 20 purpose of calculating salary incentive aid, as provided for in 21 Section 18-201.1 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes. 22

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B. All amounts apportioned pursuant to paragraph A shall be
divided into eleven (11) equal amounts to be apportioned each month
during the fiscal year.

C. Each school district superintendent shall allot to each 4 5 school principal an amount in accordance with the calculation that is due based on the number of full-time, certified teachers, as 6 7 defined by Section 1-116 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, in each principal's school. The principal shall be charged with 8 9 distributing raises based on a variety of factors, including but not 10 limited to, number of years teaching, level of education, and TLE scores. No raise shall be more than Ten Thousand Dollars 11 12 (\$10,000.00). The principal shall justify to the local district board of education and superintendent every raise and submit a 13 report to the superintendent with this information. 14 The superintendent shall make the information available to the board of 15 education. The superintendent shall also submit this information to 16 the State Board of Education and to the Legislature. This report 17 shall be submitted no later than October 1 of each year. 18

D. Each superintendent shall be allowed to retain one and one half percent (1.5%) for the purpose of providing a one-time stipend or a raise to those principals who show the most courage in rewarding their most deserving teachers.

E. Monies expended or distributed from the Oklahoma EducationImprovement Revolving Fund shall supplement, and shall not be used

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to supplant or replace, other state funds supporting common education or early childhood education, including, but not limited to, the Permanent School Fund, the Oklahoma Education Lottery Trust Fund, the Education Reform Revolving Fund, the Common School Fund and appropriations from the Legislature as provided in Article XIII, Section 1a of the Constitution and any other appropriations from the Legislature used for education purposes.

8 F. The Legislature shall appropriate the monies from the 9 Oklahoma Education Improvement Revolving Fund solely to supplement 10 other funds supporting common education and early childhood 11 education. The Legislature shall not appropriate such monies to 12 supplant or replace any other state funds supporting common 13 education and early childhood education.

In order to ensure that the monies from the Oklahoma G. 14 15 Education Improvement Revolving Fund are used to enhance and not supplant funding for education, the State Board of Equalization 16 shall examine and investigate appropriations from the fund each 17 year. At the meeting of the State Board of Equalization held within 18 five (5) days after the monthly apportionment in February of each 19 year, the State Board of Equalization shall issue a finding and 20 report which shall state whether appropriations from the Oklahoma 21 Education Improvement Revolving Fund were used to enhance or 22 supplant education funding. If the State Board of Equalization 23 finds that education funding was supplanted by monies from the 24

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Oklahoma Education Improvement Revolving Fund, the State Board of
Equalization shall specify the amount by which education funding was
supplanted. In this event the Legislature shall not make any
appropriations for the ensuing fiscal year until an appropriation in
that amount is made to replenish the Oklahoma Education Improvement
Revolving Fund.

7 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective upon certification 8 of election returns favoring passage of the Constitutional Amendment 9 proposed in Senate Joint Resolution No. ____ of the 2nd Session of the 10 56th Oklahoma Legislature.

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
