NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 24-100.11 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 14 A. Each school district board of education in this state shall 15 adopt a policy regarding sex trafficking and exploitation prevention 16 17 and education programs for students. Each school district board of education in this state shall 18 В. provide schoolwide education programs to all students in grades six 19 through twelve and staff addressing sex trafficking and exploitation 20 prevention and awareness. 21 С. The State Department of Education shall develop and make 22 available to every public school that serves sixth through twelfth 23 grades in this state curriculum that shall be taught as a stand-24

1 alone unit of instruction regarding human trafficking with an emphasis on sex trafficking. The curriculum shall be age 2 appropriate and shall include an emphasis on exploitation 3 prevention. For students in grades nine through twelve, curriculum 4 5 shall specifically include the following: 1. Definitions and nature of sex trafficking and exploitation; 6 2. Current laws of sex trafficking and exploitation in 7 Oklahoma; 8 9 3. Facts and statistics of sex trafficking and exploitation in Oklahoma and throughout the United States; 10 4. How sex traffickers profile victims; 11 The role of online computer activity; 12 5. 6. How demand is created and the industries that influence sex 13 trafficking and exploitation; 14 7. How to identify a potential victim and what to do when a 15 person identifies a victim; 16 Understanding force, fraud, and coercion; 8. 17 Understanding how traffickers groom a victim; 9. 18 The differences between prostitution and sex trafficking 10. 19 and exploitation; 20 11. The role that pornography plays in sex trafficking and 21 exploitation; 22 12. Understanding the complexities of abuse, indoctrination, 23 and manipulation; 24

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1 13. Understanding the physiological makeup of a sex trafficking
 2 victim;

3 14. Rescuing victims of sex trafficking and exploitation; and
4 15. How to engage in the fight against sex trafficking and
5 exploitation.

The State Department of Education shall develop and make 6 D. available to every public school that serves sixth through twelfth 7 grades in this state curriculum that shall be taught as a stand-8 9 alone unit of instruction regarding social media and how students may best protect themselves from exploitation when using social 10 media and internet services including, but not limited to, online 11 12 gaming, chat rooms, and email. The curriculum shall be age 13 appropriate and shall be updated annually to respond to changes in social media. 14

E. The State Department of Education may collaborate with
outside organizations including law enforcement agencies to develop
the curriculum required by this section at no cost to the State
Department of Education. The curriculum shall be provided at no
cost to school districts.

F. Curriculum used by a school district pursuant to this section shall be made available for public inspection on the school district's website.

G. The curriculum required in subsections C and D of thissection shall be combined into a single unit.

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For grades six through eight, the curriculum shall be taught
 as a ninety-minute unit divided into forty-five-minute segments over
 two (2) days, which may not be consecutive, but each segment shall
 be provided no more than one week apart.

For grades nine through twelve, the curriculum shall be
taught as a one-hundred-thirty-five-minute unit divided into fortyfive-minute segments over three (3) days, which may not be
consecutive, but each segment shall be provided no more than one
week apart.

School districts shall provide parents and legal guardians 10 Η. of students written notification, which includes an explanation of 11 12 the presentation, who the presenter(s) will be, and any organization with which the presenter is affiliated, at least seven (7) days 13 prior to presentation of the curriculum. The notification shall 14 include information to parents and legal guardians that they may opt 15 their student out of the curriculum by providing written notice to 16 the school district. 17

I. Each school district board of education may partner with nonprofit organizations and law enforcement agencies that specialize in outreach and education programs on sex trafficking and exploitation to make literature that addresses sex trafficking and exploitation available and to assist in presenting the curriculum to students. Literature and assistance provided pursuant to this subsection shall be at no cost to school districts and shall be

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1 limited in scope to the topics and guidance provided in subsections
2 B, C, and D of this section. Any literature provided pursuant to
3 this subsection shall be made available for public inspection on the
4 school district's website.

5 J. The State Department of Education shall develop and make available to the public on its website a ninety-minute education 6 video that addresses sex trafficking, exploitation prevention, and 7 social media use. The program shall be divided into segments not to 8 9 exceed twenty (20) minutes each. The Department shall also make available on its website links to materials that complement the 10 education video and links to nonprofit organizations that specialize 11 12 in outreach and education programs on sex trafficking and exploitation. The education video required by this subsection shall 13 address the topics outlined in paragraphs 1 through 15 of subsection 14 C of this section as well as concrete steps that parents and legal 15 guardians can take to protect children from exploitation. 16

17 K. The State Department of Education shall identify resources 18 and provide exemplar units or sample lesson plans designed to help 19 teachers provide instruction on the subject matters outlined in this 20 section.

21 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025. 22 23 24
