

1 2. Be a guide to state and local flood control policy; and

2 3. Contribute to water development when possible.

3 B. The state flood plan shall include:

4 1. An evaluation of the condition and adequacy of flood control
5 infrastructure on a watershed basis;

6 2. A state-wide list of ongoing and proposed flood control and
7 mitigation projects and strategies necessary to protect against the
8 loss of life and property from flooding and a discussion of how
9 those projects and strategies might further water development where
10 applicable;

11 3. An analysis of completed, ongoing and proposed flood control
12 projects included in previous state flood plans including which
13 projects received funding;

14 4. An analysis of development in special flood hazard areas, as
15 defined by the Federal Emergency Management Agency; and

16 5. Legislative recommendations the Board considers necessary to
17 facilitate flood control planning and project construction.

18 C. On adoption of a state flood plan, the Oklahoma Water
19 Resources Board shall deliver the plan to the Governor, President
20 Pro Tempore of the Senate and Speaker of the House of
21 Representatives.

22 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1624 of Title 82, unless there
24 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 A. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving
2 fund for the Oklahoma Water Resources Board to be designated the
3 "State Flood Resiliency Revolving Fund".

4 B. The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal
5 year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the
6 Board from the appropriations, apportionments, donations, federal
7 funding and fee revenues designated for the purposes of implementing
8 the recommendations and provisions of the comprehensive state flood
9 plan.

10 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2020.
