6	AS INTRODUCED
7	An Act relating to virtual charter schools; creating a task force to study and make recommendations on
8	virtual charter school operations; establishing expiration date; setting duties; providing for
9	membership; providing for naming of cochairs; requiring appointments by certain date; requiring
10	organizational meeting by certain date; specifying quorum; providing frequency of meetings; subjecting
11	meetings to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act; prohibiting compensation or travel reimbursement for
12	members; providing for staff support; requiring certain report; directing submission of report;
13	providing for noncodification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
18	codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:
19	A. There is hereby created until July 31, 2019, a task force to
20	study and make recommendations to the Legislature on the virtual
21	charter school system. The task force's study shall include but not
22	be limited to virtual charter school graduation rates and
23	calculations; student attendance policies; student eligibility and
24	applicability of student transfer laws; funding mechanisms;

- incentives provided to students, parents and teachers; transparency of administrative costs and activity fund accounts; management arrangements and/or contracts with for-profit entities; and performance of virtual charter schools based on student assessments required by Section 1210.508 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes and the annual reports required by Section 1210.545 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- 8 B. The task force shall be comprised of ten (10) members to be 9 appointed as follows:
 - 1. One member who is a member of the Senate, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate;

- 2. One member who is a member of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- 3. One member who represents a statewide association of school board members, appointed by the State Department of Education;
- 4. One member who represents a statewide organization that represents school administrators, appointed by the State Department of Education;
- 5. One member who is a superintendent or financial officer for a school district with an average daily membership (ADM) of one thousand (1,000) students or less, appointed by the State Department of Education;
- 6. One member who is a superintendent or financial officer for a school district with an ADM of more than one thousand (1,000)

1 students but less than two thousand five hundred (2,500) students, 2 appointed by the State Department of Education;

- 7. One member who is a superintendent or financial officer for a school district with an ADM of more than two thousand five hundred (2,500) students but less than ten thousand (10,000) students, appointed by the State Department of Education;
- 8. One member who is a superintendent or financial officer for a school district with an ADM of more than ten thousand (10,000) students, appointed by the State Department of Education;
- 9. One member who is appointed by the Superintendent of Public Instruction; and
- 10. One member who is appointed by the Executive Director of the Statewide Virtual Charter School Board.

The cochairs of the task force shall be a member of the Senate selected by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and a member of the House of Representatives selected by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

- C. Appointments to the task force shall be made within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this act. The task force shall conduct an organizational meeting not later than August 31, 2018.
- D. A quorum of the task force shall be required to approve any final action of the task force. For purposes of this section, six (6) members shall constitute a quorum.

- E. The task force may meet as often as may be required in order to perform the duties imposed upon it.
 - F. The meetings of the task force shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.
 - G. Members of the task force shall receive no compensation or travel reimbursement.
 - H. Staff support shall be provided by the State Department of Education.
 - I. The task force shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations by August 1, 2019, to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the chairs of the education committees of the Senate and House of Representatives.
- 14 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2018.
 - SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
