15	participation in certain school year; updating statutory references; providing an effective date;		
16	and declaring an emergency.

18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:		
19	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 2603, is		
20	amended to read as follows:		
21	Section 2603. A. Except as otherwise provided for in		
22	subsection B of this section and elsewhere in this section, to be		
23	eligible to participate in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access		
24 27	Program and to qualify for an award which includes payment of an		

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¹ amount equivalent to resident tuition or other tuition pursuant to ² Section 2604 of this title for the first semester or other academic ³ unit of postsecondary enrollment, a student shall:

I. Be a resident of this state or be enrolled in a school district located in this state that serves students who reside in both this state and an adjacent state pursuant to a contract as authorized in Section 5-117.1 of this title;

8 2. Be a United States citizen or lawfully present in the United 9 States. A student who is not a United States citizen or lawfully 10 present in the United States shall not be eligible to participate in 11 the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program and to qualify for an 12 award notwithstanding the provisions of Section 3242 of this title. 13 The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any student who 14 was enrolled in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program prior to 15 the end of the 2006-2007 school year;

16 3. Have a record of satisfactory compliance with agreements 17 executed pursuant to Section 2605 of this title;

4. a. have graduated within the previous three (3) years
from a high school accredited by the State Board of
Education, or the Oklahoma School of Science and
Mathematics with a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point
average on a 4.0 scale for all work attempted in
grades nine through twelve,

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1 have graduated within the previous three (3) years b. 2 from a high school not accredited by the State Board 3 of Education with a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point 4 average on a 4.0 scale for all work attempted in 5 grades nine through twelve and have achieved a 6 composite score of 22 or higher on the ACT test, or 7 с. have satisfactorily completed within the previous 8 three (3) years an educational program that was 9 provided through a means other than a public or 10 private school and have achieved a composite score of 11 22 or higher on the ACT test; 12 5. Have completed the curricular requirements for admission to 13 an institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education 14 and one additional unit or set of competencies in a course that 15 meets college admission requirements. The curriculum requirements 16 shall include two units or sets of competencies in foreign or non-17 English language or technology courses that meet the college 18 admission requirements and one unit or set of competencies of a fine 19 arts course. Students shall also have attained a 2.5 grade point 20 average in the core curriculum courses. Students who attended a 21 high school which did not offer all the core curriculum courses or 22 students who were educated by other means and were not offered all 23 the core curriculum courses shall be allowed to satisfy this 24 curriculum requirement by participating in a program approved by the _ _

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¹ Oklahoma State Regents <u>for Higher Education</u> for remediation of high
² school curricular deficiencies;

6. Have satisfied admission standards as determined by the
Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education for first-time-entering
students for the appropriate type of institution, or, if attending a
private institution, have satisfied admission standards as
determined by the private institution. No student participating in
the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program shall be admitted into
an institution of higher education by special admission standards;

10 7. Have secured admission to, and enrolled in, an institution 11 which is a member of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, 12 a postsecondary vocational-technical program offered by a technology 13 center school that meets the requirements to be eligible for federal 14 student financial aid, or a private institution of higher learning 15 located within this state and accredited pursuant to Section 4103 of 16 this title; and

17 8. have established financial need according to the a. 18 provisions of subsection D of Section 2605 of this 19 title and standards and provisions promulgated by the 20 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, 21 b. if the student was adopted between birth and twelve 22 (12) years of age while in the permanent custody of 23 the Department of Human Services, in the court-ordered 24 custody of a licensed private nonprofit child-placing _ _

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1 agency, or federally recognized Indian tribe, as 2 defined by the federal Indian Child Welfare Act, have 3 established financial need according to the provisions 4 of paragraph 1 of subsection E of Section 2605 of this 5 title and standards and provisions promulgated by the 6 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, or 7 с. if the student was adopted between thirteen (13) and 8 seventeen (17) years of age while in the permanent 9 custody of the Department of Human Services, in the 10 court-ordered custody of a licensed private nonprofit 11 child-placing agency, or federally recognized Indian 12 tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child Welfare 13 Act, have established financial need according to the 14 provisions of paragraph 2 of subsection E of Section 15 2605 of this title and standards and provisions 16 promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 17 Education, or 18 if the student was placed in the custody of the d. 19 Department of Human Services at any time during the 20 eighth, ninth, tenth, or eleventh grades and enrolls 21 in the program no later than his or her official date 22 of high school graduation, have established financial 23 need according to the provisions of paragraph 3 of

subsection E of Section 2605 of this title and

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standards and provisions promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education.

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B. 1. A student shall be eligible to participate in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program and to qualify for an award which includes payment of an amount equivalent to resident tuition or other tuition pursuant to Section 2604 of this title for the first semester or other academic unit of postsecondary enrollment if the student meets all of the following criteria:

- 9 is a child of any person killed after January 1, 2000, a. 10 in the line of duty in any branch of the United States 11 Armed Forces or who died after January 1, 2000, as a 12 result of an injury sustained while in the line of 13 duty in any branch of the United States Armed Forces 14 and the person who was killed or died filed an 15 individual or joint Oklahoma income tax return for the 16 tax year prior to the year during which the person was 17 killed or died,
- b. is a resident of this state or is enrolled in a school district located in this state that serves students who reside in both this state and an adjacent state pursuant to a contract as authorized in Section 5-117.1 of this title,
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- c. enrolls in an institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education prior to reaching the age of twenty-one (21),
- 4 d. has satisfied admission standards as determined by the 5 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education for first-6 time-entering students for the appropriate type of 7 institution, or, if attending a private institution, 8 has satisfied admission standards as determined by the 9 private institution. No student participating in the 10 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program shall be 11 admitted into an institution of higher education by 12 special admission standards,
- 13 has secured admission to, and enrolled in, an e. 14 institution which is a member of The Oklahoma State 15 System of Higher Education, a postsecondary 16 vocational-technical program offered by a technology 17 center school that meets the requirements to be 18 eligible for federal student financial aid, or a 19 private institution of higher learning located within 20 this state and accredited pursuant to Section 4103 of 21 this title, and
- f. executes an agreement pursuant to subsection C of
 Section 2605 of this title.
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2. A student who is eligible to participate in the program
 pursuant to this subsection shall not be required to meet the
 eligibility requirements set forth in subsection A of this section.

C. To retain eligibility while pursuing the program of higher learning in which enrolled, the student shall:

6 1. Meet the requirements for retention and degree completion as 7 established by the institution in which the student is enrolled;

8 2. Maintain good academic standing and satisfactory academic 9 progress according to standards of the Oklahoma State Regents for 10 Higher Education;

Maintain satisfactory academic progress as required for eligibility for federal Title IV student financial aid programs. The provisions of this paragraph shall become effective for the 2012-2013 school year;

¹⁵ 4. Comply with the standards related to maintenance of ¹⁶ eligibility as promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher ¹⁷ Education; and

18 5. Refrain from conduct that leads to expulsion or suspension 19 of more than one semester from an institution of higher education. 20 A student who violates the provisions of this paragraph shall 21 permanently lose eligibility for program benefits. The provisions 22 of this paragraph shall become effective January 1, 2008.

D. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and the State Board of Career and Technology Education shall promulgate

¹ rules relating to maintenance of eligibility under the Oklahoma
² Higher Learning Access Act by a student.

E. It is the intent of the Legislature that students in the ninth grade for the 1992-93 school year who are determined to be eligible Oklahoma Higher Learning Access students pursuant to the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Act shall be the first students eligible for benefits from the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust Fund.

9 F. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education are 10 authorized to study, develop, and propose criteria for determining 11 award eligibility based upon the completion of seven semesters of 12 high school coursework by a student.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 2605, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 400, O.S.L. 2022 (70 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 2605), is amended to read as follows:

16 Section 2605. A. Each school year, every fifth- through 17 eleventh-grade student in the public and private schools of this 18 state and students who are educated by other means and are in the 19 equivalent of the fifth through eleventh grade shall be apprised, 20 together with the parent, custodial parent, or guardian of the 21 student, of the opportunity for access to higher learning under the 22 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program. The Oklahoma State Regents 23 for Higher Education and the State Board of Education shall develop, 24 promote, and coordinate a public awareness program to be utilized in _ _

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¹ making students and parents aware of the Oklahoma Higher Learning
² Access Program.

3 On a form provided by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Β. 4 Education, every public school district shall designate at least one 5 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program contact person, who shall be 6 a counselor or teacher, at each public school site in this state in 7 which eighth-, ninth-, tenth-, or eleventh-grade classes are taught. 8 When requested by the State Regents, the State Board of Education 9 shall assist the State Regents to ensure the designation of contact 10 persons. Private schools shall also designate at least one school 11 official as a contact person. For students who are educated by 12 other means, a parent or quardian or other person approved by the 13 State Regents shall be designated the contact person.

14 Students who qualify on the basis of financial need C. 1. 15 according to subsection D or E of this section or who meet the 16 eligibility qualification set forth in subparagraph a of paragraph 1 17 of subsection B of Section 2603 of this title prior to entering the 18 eleventh grade or prior to reaching the age of sixteen (16) and the 19 standards and provisions promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents 20 for Higher Education shall be given the opportunity throughout the 21 eighth-, ninth-, tenth-, and eleventh-grade years, for students 22 enrolled in a public or private school, or between the ages of 23 thirteen (13) and sixteen (16), for students who are educated by 24 other means, to enter into participation in the program by agreeing _ _

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1 to, throughout the remainder of their school years or educational
2 program:

3	a.	attend school or an educational program regularly and
4		do homework regularly,
5	b.	refrain from substance abuse,
6	с.	refrain from commission of crimes or delinquent acts,
7	d.	have school work and school records reviewed by

3. The contact person shall maintain the agreements, which
shall be executed on forms provided by the Oklahoma State Regents
for Higher Education and managed according to regulations
promulgated by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education, and
the contact person shall monitor compliance of the student with the

¹ terms of the agreement. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
² Education are authorized to process student agreements and verify
³ compliance with the agreements. Students failing to comply with the
⁴ terms of the agreement shall not be eligible for the awards provided
⁵ in Section 2604 of this title.

D. Except as otherwise provided for in subsection E of this
 section and except for students who qualify pursuant to subsection B
 of Section 2603 of this title, a student shall not be found to be in
 financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access
 Program if:

11 1. At the time the student applies for participation in the 12 program during the eighth, ninth, or tenth grade for students 13 enrolled in a public or private school, or between the ages of 14 thirteen (13) and fifteen (15), for students who are educated by 15 other means, the income from taxable and nontaxable sources of the 16 student's parent(s) exceeds Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per 17 year;

Beginning with eighth-, ninth-, or tenth-grade students who are enrolled in a public or private school or students between the ages of thirteen (13) and fifteen (15) who are educated by other means who apply for participation in the program in the 2017-2018 school year, the federal adjusted gross income of the student's parent(s) exceeds Fifty-five Thousand Dollars (\$55,000.00) per year;

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Beginning with eighth-, ninth-, tenth-, or eleventh-grade students who are enrolled in a public or private school or students between the ages of thirteen (13) and sixteen (16) who are educated by other means who apply for participation in the program in the 2021-2022 school year, the federal adjusted gross income of the student's parent(s) exceeds Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00) per year;

8 4. 3. Beginning with eighth-, ninth-, tenth-, or eleventh-grade
9 students who are enrolled in a public or private school or students
10 between the ages of thirteen (13) and sixteen (16) who are educated
11 by other means who apply for participation in the program in the
12 2022-2023 school year:

13 the federal adjusted gross income of the student's а. 14 parent(s), who have two or fewer dependent children, 15 exceeds Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00) per year, 16 b. the federal adjusted gross income of the student's 17 parent(s), who have three or four dependent children, 18 exceeds Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per 19 year, or

20 c. the federal adjusted gross income of the student's 21 parent(s), who have five or more dependent children, 22 exceeds Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000.00) per year; 23 <u>5. At the time the student begins postsecondary education and</u> 24 prior to receiving any Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program

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benefit award, the federal adjusted gross income of the student's
parent(s) exceeds One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) per
year;

4 6. 4. Beginning with the 2018-2019 academic year, prior to 5 receiving any Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award 6 for any year during which the student is enrolled in an institution 7 which is a member of The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education, 8 a postsecondary vocational-technical program offered by a technology 9 center school that meets the requirements to be eligible for federal 10 student financial aid, or a private institution of higher learning 11 located within this state and accredited pursuant to Section 4103 of 12 this title, the federal adjusted gross income of the student's 13 parent(s) exceeds One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) per 14 year.

The determination of financial qualification as set forth in paragraphs 5 and 6 of this subsection this paragraph shall be based on the income of the student, not the income of the parent(s), if a student:

- a. is determined to be independent of the student's
 parents for federal financial aid purposes,
 b. was in the permanent custody of the Department of
 Human Services at the time the student enrolled in the
 program, or
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c. was in the court-ordered custody of a federally recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child Welfare Act, at the time the student enrolled in the program.

The provisions of this paragraph shall apply to any student who has received an Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award after the 2017-2018 school year; and

8 7. 5. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall 9 review the determination of financial qualification as set forth in 10 paragraphs 1, 2, and 3, and 4 of this subsection if the income from 11 taxable and nontaxable sources of the student's parent(s) includes 12 income received from nontaxable military benefits or income received 13 from the federal Social Security Administration due to the death or 14 disability of the student's parent(s). If the income from taxable 15 and nontaxable sources of the student's parent(s), excluding income 16 received from nontaxable military benefits or income received from 17 the federal Social Security Administration due to the death or 18 disability of the student's parent(s), does not exceed the 19 limitations set forth by paragraphs 1, 2, and 3, - and 4 of this 20 subsection, the student shall be determined to have met the 21 financial qualification set forth in paragraphs 1, 2, and 3_{-} and 4_{-} 22 of this subsection.

E. 1. A student who was adopted between birth and twelve (12) years of age while in the permanent custody of the Department of

1 Human Services, in the court-ordered custody of a licensed private 2 nonprofit child-placing agency, or federally recognized Indian 3 tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child Welfare Act, shall not 4 be found to be in financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Higher 5 Learning Access Program if at the time the student begins 6 postsecondary education and prior to receiving any Oklahoma Higher 7 Learning Access Program benefit award, the federal adjusted gross 8 income of the student's parent(s) exceeds One Hundred Fifty Thousand 9 Dollars (\$150,000.00) per year. The provisions of this paragraph 10 shall not apply to any student who has received an Oklahoma Higher 11 Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the 2012-2013 school 12 year.

13 A student who was adopted between thirteen (13) and 2. 14 seventeen (17) years of age while in the permanent custody of the 15 Department of Human Services, in the court-ordered custody of a 16 licensed private nonprofit child-placing agency, or federally 17 recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child 18 Welfare Act, shall not be found to be in financial need for purposes 19 of the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program if at the time the 20 student begins postsecondary education and prior to receiving any 21 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award, the federal 22 adjusted gross income of the student's parent(s) exceeds Two Hundred 23 Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) per year. The provisions of this 24 paragraph shall not apply to any student who has received an _ _

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Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the 2 2012-2013 school year.

3 3. <u>A student who was placed in the custody of the Department of</u>
<u>Human Services at any time during the eighth, ninth, tenth, or</u>
<u>eleventh grades and enrolls in the program no later than his or her</u>
<u>official date of high school graduation shall not be found to be in</u>
<u>financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access</u>
<u>Program if the federal adjusted gross income of the student exceeds</u>
Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00) per year.

10 4. Except for students who qualify pursuant to subsection B of 11 Section 2603 of this title, the determination of financial 12 qualification as set forth in this subsection shall be based on the 13 income of the student, not the income of the parent(s), if the 14 student is determined to be independent of the student's parent(s) 15 for federal financial aid purposes. A determination of financial 16 qualification shall not be required for the student who meets the 17 criteria set forth in this subsection at the time the student 18 applies for participation in the program. The provisions of this 19 paragraph shall not apply to any student who has received an 20 Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program benefit award prior to the 21 2008-2009 school year.

F. The financial qualification of a student as set forth in subsections D and E of this section shall be certified by the contact person or by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education

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on the agreement form provided by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education. The form shall be retained in the permanent record of the student and a copy forwarded to the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education.

G. Agreements shall be witnessed by the parent, custodial parent, or guardian of the student, who shall further agree to: Agreement the student in achieving compliance with the

1. Assist the student in achieving compliance with the
agreements;

9 2. Confer, when requested to do so, with the school contact 10 person, other school personnel, and program mentors;

11 3. Provide information requested by the Oklahoma State Regents 12 for Higher Education or the State Board of Education; and

4. Assist the student in completing forms and reports required for program participation, making applications to institutions and schools of higher learning, and filing applications for student grants and scholarships.

17 Students who are enrolled in a school district located in н. 18 this state that serves students who reside in both this state and an 19 adjacent state pursuant to a contract as authorized in Section 5-20 117.1 of this title, are in the eleventh and twelfth grades during 21 the 2006-2007 school year, and who were denied participation in the 22 program shall be allowed to enter or reenter into participation in 23 the program by entering into agreements as set forth in subsections 24 C and D of this section by June 1, 2008. _ _

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¹ I. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall ² promulgate rules for the determination of student compliance with ³ agreements made pursuant to this section.

4 J. I. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall
5 designate personnel to coordinate tracking of program records for
6 the years when students participating in the program are still in
7 the schools or are being educated by other means, provide staff
8 development for contact persons in the schools, and provide liaison
9 with the State Board of Education and local organizations and
10 individuals participating in the program.

11 K. J. The school district where an Oklahoma Higher Learning 12 Access Program student is enrolled when the student begins 13 participation in the program and any subsequent school district 14 where the student enrolls shall forward information regarding 15 participation by the student in the program to a school to which the 16 student transfers upon the request of the school for the records of 17 the student.

18 L. K. Students participating in the Oklahoma Higher Learning
 19 Access Program shall provide their Social Security number or their
 20 student identification number used by their school to the Oklahoma
 21 State Regents for Higher Education. The Regents shall keep the
 22 numbers confidential and use them only for administrative purposes.
 23 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.

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1	SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
2	of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
3	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
4	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
