6 An Act relating to the Grand River Dam Authority;
7 amending 82 O.S. 2021, Section 862.1, which relates
8 to exemptions from the Open Records Act for the
9 Authority; providing for the exemption of certain
10 records from the Authority for certain purposes; and
11 providing an effective date.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 82 O.S. 2021, Section 862.1, is
14 amended to read as follows:

15 Section 862.1. In addition to the powers, rights and privileges
16 enumerated in Section 862 of this title, the Grand River Dam
17 Authority shall be exempt from the provisions of the:

18 1. The Oklahoma Open Records Act, exclusively limited to:

- 19 a. customer proprietary information the Authority is
20 contractually obligated to keep confidential, ~~and~~
21 b. security plans and procedures in its role as an
22 electric utility regulated by the federal government,
23 c. information related to the security of electrical or
24 dam infrastructure and related information systems
that, if misused, could interfere with, attack,

1 compromise, or incapacitate the infrastructure or
2 information systems including information related to
3 the ability of the infrastructure or information
4 systems to resist such interference, compromise, or
5 incapacitation. Such information includes, but is not
6 limited to, any planned or past assessment,
7 projection, or estimate of the vulnerability of
8 critical infrastructure or information system,
9 security testing, risk evaluation, risk management
10 plans, operational plans, structural schematics,
11 recovery or response plans, or risk audits, and
12 d. proprietary or commercial information received subject
13 to a nondisclosure agreement or confidentiality
14 agreement;

15 2. The Oklahoma Open Meeting Act, exclusively limited to
16 authorizing the Grand River Dam Authority Board of Directors to
17 confer on:

- 18 a. coal or gas fuel supply and transportation contracts,
- 19 b. power purchase agreements, and
- 20 c. security plans and procedures in its role as an
- 21 electric utility regulated by the federal government;
- 22 and

23 3. Title 61 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

1 4. The Information Technology Consolidation and Coordination
2 Act;

3 5. The State Travel Reimbursement Act; and

4 6. The Surplus Property Act; provided that, the district may,
5 on a transactional basis, elect to make itself subject to the
6 requirements of the Surplus Property Act.

7 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
