Supp. 16 2017, Section 18-114.14), which relates to a minimum salary schedule, providing for codification; 17 providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency. 18 19 20 21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 22 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 18-114.15 of Title 70, unless 23

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there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Beginning with the 2018-2019 school year, certified teachers, as defined in Section 1-116 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, in the public schools of Oklahoma shall receive in salary and/or fringe benefits not less than the amounts specified in the following schedule:

The Board shall accept teaching experience from primary and secondary schools that are operated by the United States Department of Defense or are affiliated with the United States Department of State.
- D. For the purpose of state salary increments and retirement, no teacher shall be granted credit for more than five (5) years of active duty in the military service or out-of-state or out-of-country teaching experience as a certified teacher or its equivalent. Nothing in this section shall prohibit boards of

education from crediting more years of experience on district salary schedules than those allowed for state purposes.

- E. The State Board of Education shall recognize, for purposes of certification and salary increments, all the years of experience of a:
- 1. Certified teacher who teaches in the educational program of the Department of Corrections, beginning with fiscal year 1981;
- 2. Vocational rehabilitation counselor under the Department of Human Services if the counselor was employed as a certified teacher by the State Department of Education when the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation was transferred from the State Board of Career and Technology Education or the State Board of Education to the Oklahoma Public Welfare Commission on July 1, 1968;
- 3. Vocational rehabilitation counselor which were completed while employed by the Department of Human Services if such counselor was certified as a teacher or was eligible for certification as a teacher in Oklahoma;
- 4. Certified teacher which were completed while employed by the Department of Human Services Child Study Center at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center, if the teacher was certified as a teacher in Oklahoma; and
- 5. Certified school psychologist or psychometrist which were completed while employed as a doctoral intern, psychological assistant, or psychologist with any agency of the State of Oklahoma

if the experience primarily involved work with persons of school- or preschool-age and if the person was, at the time the experience was acquired, certified as, or eligible for certification as, a school psychologist or psychometrist.

- F. The provisions of this section shall not apply to teachers who have entered into postretirement employment with a public school in Oklahoma and are still receiving a monthly retirement benefit.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 18-114.16 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. Beginning with the 2019-2020 school year, certified teachers, as defined in Section 1-116 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, in the public schools of Oklahoma shall receive in salary and/or fringe benefits not less than the amounts specified in the following schedule:

SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 18-114.18 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Beginning with the 2021-2022 school year, each school year the salary level of each teacher employed by a public school district shall be adjusted to equal the regional average salary for a teacher with the same years of experience, hours and duties. The annual adjustment may increase the salary of a teacher above the minimum salary level set forth in Section 3 of this act but in no case shall the amount of a teacher salary be less than the minimum salary level. For purposes of this section, the regional average teacher

with the same years of experience, hours and duties. The annual adjustment may increase the salary of a teacher above the minimum salary level set forth in Section 3 of this act but in no case shall the amount of a teacher salary be less than the minimum salary level. For purposes of this section, the regional average teacher salary shall be calculated using salary expenditures for each of the following states: Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Texas, averaged together. By January 1 of each year the State Board of Education shall calculate and report the regional average teacher salary based on information reported annually in the Digest of Education Statistics by the National Center of Education Statistics.

SECTION 5. REPEALER 70 O.S. 2011, Section 18-114.14, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 59, O.S.L. 2017 and as last

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amended by Section 1, Chapter 26, O.S.L. 2017 (70 O.S. Supp. 2017,
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    Section 18-114.14), is hereby repealed.
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        SECTION 6. This act shall become effective July 1, 2018.
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        SECTION 7. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
    of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
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    declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
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    be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
