B. A person who meets the criteria of subsection A of this
section shall not be subject to prosecution or receive a mitigated
sentence for a drug offense or shall not have property seized or
forfeited on the basis of a drug violation if evidence is obtained
that they were seeking emergency medical assistance or intervening
to prevent a drug overdose.

14 C. A person may not initiate or maintain an action against a 15 peace officer or the employing political subdivision based on the 16 officer's compliance or failure to comply with this section.

D. For the purposes of this section, "peace officer" shall have the same meaning as defined in Section 99 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2018.
