        SECTION 1.

                                       47 O.S. 2011, Section 1167, as
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    last amended by Section 1, Chapter 324, O.S.L. 2013 (47 O.S. Supp.
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    2015, Section 1167), is amended to read as follows:
        Section 1167. A. The Corporation Commission is hereby
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    authorized to promulgate rules pursuant to the Administrative
    Procedures Act to establish the amounts of fees, fines and penalties
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    as set forth in this act. The Corporation Commission shall notify
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    all interested parties of any proposed rules to be promulgated as
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    provided herein and shall provide such parties an opportunity to be
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    heard prior to promulgation.
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            Fines and penalties established by the Corporation
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    Commission for violation of commercial vehicle weight limitations or
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    violation of overweight permit requirements shall not be subject to
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    the administrative cap on Corporation Commission fines as set forth
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- in Section 1 of Title 17 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The Commission

  is hereby authorized to apply a multiplier to any fine or penalty

  for repeat overweight violations by a carrier within a one-year

  period.
  - <u>C.</u> The Corporation Commission shall adjudicate enforcement actions initiated by Corporation Commission personnel.
  - C. D. Revenue derived from all fines and penalties collected or received by the Corporation Commission pursuant to the provisions of this act shall be apportioned as follows:
- 10 1. For the period beginning with the effective date of this act, the first Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) 11 12 collected or received each fiscal year shall be remitted to the Department of Public Safety for the purpose of staffing the port of 13 entry weigh stations to conduct safety inspections. The next Five 14 Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$550,000.00) shall be remitted to 15 the Oklahoma Tax Commission and apportioned as provided in Section 16 1104 of this title; 17
  - 2. One-half (1/2) of the remaining amount shall be deposited to the Trucking One-Stop Shop Fund created in subsection D of this section; and
- 3. One-half (1/2) of the remaining amount shall be deposited to the Weigh Station Improvement Revolving Fund created in subsection E of this section.

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- D. E. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the Corporation Commission to be known and designated as the "Trucking One-Stop Shop Fund". The Trucking One-Stop Shop Fund shall consist of:
- 1. All funds apportioned thereto in subsection  $\frac{C}{D}$  of this section;
- 2. Fees collected by the Commission to be retained as a motor license agent or other Corporation Commission registration or motor fuel fees as allowed by statute or rule; and
- 3. Any other monies to be utilized for the Trucking One-Stop

  11 Shop Act.

The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year 12 limitations, and shall not be subject to legislative appropriation. 13 Monies in the Trucking One-Stop Shop Fund shall only be expended for 14 direct expenses relating to the Trucking One-Stop Shop Act. 15 Expenditures from the revolving fund shall be made pursuant to the 16 laws of this state. In addition, expenditures from the revolving 17 fund may be made pursuant to The Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act for 18 the purpose of immediately responding to emergency situations, 19 within the Commission's jurisdiction, having potentially critical 20 environmental or public safety impact. Warrants for expenditures 21 from the fund shall be drawn by the State Treasurer against claims 22 filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of 23 Management and Enterprise Services for approval and payment. 24

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1 E. F. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving 2 fund for the Department of Transportation to be designated the "Weigh Station Improvement Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a 3 4 continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall 5 consist of all monies deposited thereto. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and 6 7 expended by the Department for the purpose of constructing, equipping and maintaining facilities to determine the weight of 9 vehicles traveling on the roads and highways of this state. 10 Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the 11 Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for 12 13 approval and payment. SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2016. 14 15 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 16 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby 17 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval. 18
